Senator. It's not that section at all.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So what is it that keeps them from (inaudible) now.

SENATOR FOLEY: No, it's the language that specifically enumerates the types of medical establishments that can bid for contracts under this program. Federally qualified health centers is one of those sections, one of those types of establishments that's specifically enumerated in my amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I feel as though we're going in a circle, so I'm going to try and break it and ask the question a different way. Right now that entity is not a provider under this state program. Is that what you said, so I'm correct as I move along?

SENATOR FOLEY: I believe that's accurate.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And your understanding, and that's all we're dealing with here today, your understanding is that at the time the contracts were originally let, this entity would not have qualified to become a provider under this program.

SENATOR FOLEY: I believe that's correct as well, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And if this language...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...that you added is not adopted, that entity still could not be a provider under this program. Is that true?

SENATOR FOLEY: Under the existing language that HHS operates this program under, that is true.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And what in your language would make it possible for them to come into the program, which without your language would leave them where they're situated, meaning they cannot?
