be successful. But on the other hand, what we could do, Senator Bourne, is accept Senator Erdman's amendment, get the program started somewhere, get the successful outcomes, and then come back to the Legislature with the ongoing funding. That's one thing we could do, which would kind of violate my intent, in the sense that...to get more providers on. That's what I wanted to do. And Senator Stuthman spoke at the committee hearing very eloquently about the problem in Columbus. I've gotten an enormous amount of mail here from the residents of Lincoln. I guess it's a problem that's getting out of hand here. The problem with this one-time appropriation is we won't get service providers coming out of the woodwork to do the specific treatment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Erdman, you're recognized.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Mr. President, I withdraw the amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The amendment is withdrawn.
