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accommodate the concerns of citizens and interested parties is enormous, and they devote a substantial amount of time to trying to accomplish that. Having known the discussion we've had so far, I still can't say, well, you know what, too bad. I still think that we have an opportunity to think through this a little more. I know the discussion is going to continue. But the reality is, is that there is a disagreement, and if you would say, a disturbance in the force, and for whatever reason, I think there has to be some remedy to that. Now I don't know that I can say that both sides are pure as snow, that they've dealt in great faith, because I haven't been a part of the discussions. But I've talked with those who are, and there are things that are changing and it's a fluid discussion on issues, again, beyond the language in AM2754 and the amendment to LB 445. But I am willing to listen to Senator Smith's amendment, to listen to Senator Jensen, and to see if we're actually listening to each other, or if we're just talking at each other. And if I were Senator Jensen, I'd probably be interested in talking at you than listening to others because of the frustration that I would be experiencing, by having letters of support from one side, and then having them change their mind. I can fully understand that. But this process is about compromise, that is something that we can all agree on, and at the end of the day we have to deal in good faith. But ultimately it's our responsibility to deal in good faith with one another. If Senator Smith has an amendment before us that is attempting to make some sense and to try and find a process that is fair and balancing the interests, and if that's not the right way, I think we as a body owe it to try to figure out what that is. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Erdman. Senator Mines, you're recognized. Senator Mines, can I ask for your indulgence and go to Senator Smith first? It's your choice.

SENATOR MINES: I will indulge.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Smith.

SENATOR SMITH: Thank you, Mr. President. With unanimous consent, I would withdraw my pending amendments to AM2754.
