need. But I think that we always run a dangerous precedence when we start micromanaging a department of the administration. If they don't make it, then we can certainly come back and we do have next year, that we could address this issue. So with that, I would...Senator Cunningham, with that, I'll close. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Jensen. Senator Stuthman.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the body. I'm going to be very, very short, but as I had mentioned earlier, this kind of...there was a light flashing for me, even though it is dark, and Senator Cunningham has brought it up. We had discussed this on General File, the same bill, LB 994. We discussed it at length, and it was defeated at that time. Is that correct, Senator Howard?

SENATOR HOWARD: It is.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Howard.

SENATOR HOWARD: The change that I had made on this, as Senator Cunningham pointed out, the change that I had made on this bill was to observe the time frame that Senator Jensen and I had discussed.

SENATOR STUTHMAN: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Howard, you're next.

SENATOR HOWARD: Thank you, Mr. Chairman and members of the body. On the good advice of my colleagues and my Chairman, I am going to request to withdraw this amendment.
