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up all over the state with quarter horse racing. There has to be interaction and an engagement from our Racing Commission relative to the steps that need to be done to get up a licensed track. And the first step in doing that is to give the Racing Commission the opportunity to regulate them. Thank you, and thank you, Senator Louden.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Synowiecki. Senator Chambers, followed by Senator Mines.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I was going to pass, but I've got to say something. Senator Aguilar, I'd like to ask you a question because you may or may not be the one who said this.

SENATOR AGUILAR. Okay.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Aguilar.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did you say something about more jobs being created through this activity? And if so, who had indicated that?

SENATOR AGUILAR: I said more jobs created because of a racetrack, it being involved in your community.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, but not necessarily this activity on the racetrack.

SENATOR AGUILAR: Correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Oh, but I need to ask you another question. Are you in favor of this bill?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes, I am.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are you aware that most of the people who play these games will lose? If most of the people win, then no money is going to be made by the track.

SENATOR AGUILAR: That's usually the situation with any kind of gaming, I believe, Senator.
