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least we're being consistent. We've got an underlying bill here with the Chambers amendment that was not subject to our process. Now we have an amendment offered by Senator Heidemann...

SENATOR BAKER: Time.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: ...that didn't even make it out of committee.

SENATOR BAKER: Thank you, Senators. Senator Chambers followed by Senators Friend, Heidemann, and Synowiecki.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature--whining, whining, whining. Everybody who's been here long enough at some time or other has managed to add an amendment to a bill and the amendment was not introduced previously as a bill. So that might be something that seems startling to those not familiar with the legislative process. But it is not startling or even unusual for us who are here. I say again, the vote will be taken on Senator Heidemann's amendment. I expect it to prevail. That will give strength to the bill because there now is an interest on the part of the rural senators who said up until now they are on the outside looking in. I have received many invitations to go various places. I've been before the U.N. and I dress like this. I had a discussion with former President Carter. The only difference was that I had a blue sweatshirt then and he referred to me when he called on me for a question as the man in the blue shirt. And he got the worst of it because he thought I was just going to come and talk about what a wonderful thing it was to be in the White House. But I had issues. And when the President gives me the opportunity to address him, that's what I did. Around 1968, I was invited to appear before President Lyndon B. Johnson's so-called Riot Commission. And the conclusion...by the way, my testimony was highlighted. A magazine called Ebony did a multipage story on it, extensively quoting. But the conclusion was that America is a country of two societies: one black, one white. OPS is a school district of two districts: one black, one white. That cannot be denied. So what is to be done about it? OPS makes threats as it always does and as people will do when they have no argument. I brought a plan,
