Section 1. Section 68-901, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
 2022, is amended to read:

3 68-901 Sections 68-901 to 68-9,101 <u>and section 2 of this act shall</u>
4 be known and may be cited as the Medical Assistance Act.

5 Sec. 2. (1) No later than October 1, 2023, the department shall 6 submit applications to the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid 7 Services to amend the medicaid state plan and Children's Health Insurance 8 Program state plan to implement express lane eligibility in accordance 9 with 42 U.S.C. 1396a(e)(13).

10 (2) The state plan amendments shall identify the Division of Children and Family Services of the department as an express lane agency 11 which shall use data from the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program 12 13 for express lane eligibility determinations. The state plan amendments shall also specify that the express lane eligibility option will be used 14 for initial eligibility determinations, redeterminations, automatic 15 16 enrollment, and automatic renewals for eligible children in the medical 17 assistance program and the Children's Health Insurance Program established pursuant to 42 U.S.C. 1397aa et seq. 18

<u>(3) The applications to amend the medicaid state plan and the</u>
 <u>Children's Health Insurance Program state plan shall have an effective</u>
 <u>date for implementation of express lane eligibility no later than January</u>
 <u>1, 2024.</u>
