LB 533 changes Niobrara Council membership qualifications and the eligibility to vote on certain matters before the Council. The bill also eliminates language that the Council should meet "preferably once a month".

The changes to membership qualifications and voting eligibility should not have a fiscal impact. The elimination of the preferably once a month meeting language may result in a small expenditure savings that could be reallocated to other activities. Any such savings will be dependent on Council decisions regarding the frequency of their meetings.

Explanation of Estimate: The proposed legislation changes some of the provisions of membership on the Niobrara Council. Currently a representative chosen by each of the respective area county boards is included. The change would require the representative to be a county commissioner. Currently a representative of each agency (US Fish and Wildlife Service, USFWS, and National Park Service, NPS) is chosen by the Governor from a list of candidates submitted by the agencies to serve on the council. The change would allow each regional director of the respective agency (USFWS & NPS) or their designee to serve. Written notice to the Council and Governor is needed from each agency should they desire their representatives to be voting members. A member that is a representative of a recognized nonprofit environmental, conservation, or wildlife organization chosen by the Governor could now be designated by the organization, but would still require the Governor's selection. No fiscal impact should result from these changes.

Language on regular meetings was changed to eliminate "preferably once a month". This could result in some savings if the number of meetings were kept at the minimum six per year. Language indicating that a 'council member may not participate or vote on any matter on which he or she participated or voted as a member of a county board, county planning commission, or natural resources district board, and in such a case such council member shall not be counted for purposes of determining whether quorum or vote requirements have been satisfied" has been eliminated in the proposed bill. These changes are not expected to have a fiscal impact,
