LB 195 contains the Governors recommendation for mainline new appropriations for the FY2013-14 and FY2014-15 biennial budget. In addition to the appropriations contained in this bill, the Governors recommendation for the FY13-14 and FY14-15 biennial budget is also contained in LB 196 – Legislators Salaries, LB 197 - Constitutional Officers Salaries, and LB 198 – Capital Construction.

LB 195 also contains transfer of funds between funds in Section 258. Also in addition to the new appropriation amounts contained in the bill, LB 195 generally reappropriates FY12-13 unexpended General Fund balances for operations only. Reappropriation of aid amounts are provided for in selected instance.
