Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB 397 requires that individual and group sickness and accident insurance policies issued or renewed in the state include screening coverage for amino acid-based elemental formulas, regardless of the delivery method, for the diagnosis and treatment of specified disorders when the physician has issued an order stating the amino acid-based elemental formula is medically necessary for the treatment of a disease or disorder.

State Health Insurance Plan: The Department of Administrative Services indicates the state employee health insurance plan currently covers these screenings. DAS does not know how children currently receive screenings covered by the plan. The bill allows for deductibles and copayment provisions contained in the plan to the cost of screenings. So, the bill should have no fiscal impact for the state plan.

<u>University of Nebraska Health Insurance Plan</u>: The University of Nebraska indicates that screening tests for amino acid-based formulas are currently covered by the health plan, but are not routinely administered. The University indicates the bill will likely increase the number of tests performed. A cost estimate is difficult to project, but the fiscal note indicates about \$10,000 of increased costs for the plan each year. The University pays 82% of the premium cost of the plan, so any fiscal impact is projected to be minimal.

<u>Persons Insured through the Exchange</u>: The Department of Insurance (DOI) indicates that coverage provided by Nebraska's largest small group insurance policy has been selected as the essential benefits which must be covered in policies issued through the exchange under the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA). Any costs for benefits that are mandated by the state that are in excess of the essential benefits must be paid by the state.

The essential benefits plan selected for Nebraska cover the costs of screening for amino acid-based elemental formulas. So, the bill will not have a fiscal impact for the state to pay the costs of screenings provided to people purchasing insurance through the health insurance exchange beginning in 2014.

Explanation of Estimate:

LB397 requires screening coverage for amino acid-based elemental formulas, regardless of delivery method, for the diagnosis and treatment of Immunoglobulin E and non-Immunoglobulin E mediated allergies to multiple food proteins, food-protein-induced enterocolitis syndrome, eosinophilic disorders, and impaired absorption of nutrients caused by disorders affecting the absorptive surface, functional length, and motility of the gastrointestinal tract, when the ordering physician has issued a written order stating that the amino acid-based elemental formula is medically necessary for the treatment of a disease or disorder.

The State's health plans currently cover these screenings but are paid under each plans specific deductible and co-insurance of the plan. The number and level of screenings will vary based on the severity of the condition and changes that occur in the individual's ability to digest formulas as they grow.

It is not known how many children currently receive these screenings covered by the State's health plans. LB397 allows for the application of deductible and co-insurance to the cost of these screenings as currently provided by the State's health plans.

There is no fiscal impact on the State's Health plans.
