**Explanation of Estimate:** 

LB 1105 does not mandate specific veteran and servicemember court programs, however, a specific fiscal impact cannot be determined at this time since the number of veterans and servicemembers involved in the criminal justice system is unknown.

If the number of eligible persons is not significant and/or the intent is to serve those that are in the criminal justice system primarily due to substance abuse issues, it is estimated that the Supreme Court would use existing problem-solving courts with specific supervision for veterans and hire additional supervision officers as needed. Again, although the fiscal impact cannot be determined due to lack of data, for illustration purposes, if 60 veterans and servicemembers were served, two officers would be hired and General Fund expenditures would increase by an estimated \$178,000. The cost of one supervision officer is approximately \$89,000 (including salary, benefits, operating expenses, limited travel, equipment and assuming a caseload of 30).

If the number of eligible persons is significant and/or the intent is to serve those that are in the criminal justice system primarily due to mental health issues, the fiscal impact would increase substantially since there are no existing problem-solving courts created specifically to address those with mental health needs. New problem-solving courts would need to be established and staffed and programming developed. Again the fiscal impact would be dependent on the number and location of those to be served.

It is assumed that the cost of treatment services for veterans and servicemembers would not be a State expense.

#### Explanation of Estimate:

The creation of veterans and service member court programs and their collaboration with the Department of Veterans Affairs to maximize benefits and services for them might have a fiscal impact on the Nebraska Department of Veterans Affairs, Agency 28. Although the language is permissive ("may" page 3, line 14) for the Supreme Court to collaborate with the Nebraska Department of Veterans' Affairs, the potential impact should be noted.

The collaboration would necessitate the addition of an additional State Veteran Service Officer who would be tasked to educate, advocate, coordinate benefits of which the veteran is legally entitled. Service Officers are trained and accredited to represent veterans in order to file claims and assist in accessing services. There are currently five State Service Officers employed by the Nebraska Department of Veterans' Affairs.

The additional staffing request would also create a need for a corresponding increase in PSL of \$49,068.00 for 14-15 and \$50,321.00 for 15-16.
