Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

LB 379 is the Expanded Learning Opportunity Grant Program Act. The bill requires the State Department of Education (NDE) to administer a grant program to provide funds to community-based organizations that work in partnership with schools in high need districts to provide expanded learning opportunity programs. The first priority for grants are to continue existing federally funded 21st Century Community Learning Centers. The second priority is to support new programs in areas of the state with a high percentage of at-risk children that are not currently served by school-based or school-linked programs funded by federal 21st Century Community Learning grants. Grant recipients must provide a like match to receive the funds.

NDE is to establish a grant application process and make an effort to fund expanded learning opportunity programs in both rural and urban areas of the state. The department is to provide a report evaluating programs to the Legislature on a biennial basis. The bill provides that up to 5% of the total appropriation for the grant program may be used by NDE to administer, evaluate and provide technical assistance for expanded learning opportunity programs.

<u>Grant Program</u>: LB 379 does not specify an amount of general funds to be appropriated for the grant program. NDE indicates there were 44 grantees receiving 21st Century Community Learning grants to provide services at 115 sites in FY2013-14. The current federal program provides initial grants for five years which are decreased to 80% in the fourth year and 60% in the fifth year. Continuation funding is provided for programs at a 50% level thereafter. NDE projects federal fund revenue of \$5,350,000 in FY15, FY16 and FY17 to provide 21st Century Community Learning grants. The fiscal impact of the bill will be the amount of additional general funds provided to continue existing programs or support new grantees.

NDE Administration: It is assumed that NDE will be able to administer the program with 5% of the total appropriation provided for grants.
