Any Fiscal Notes received from state agencies and political subdivisions are attached following the Legislative Fiscal Analyst Estimate.

This bill would change Community-based Juvenile Services Aid Program provisions. The bill states that ten percent of the General Fund appropriation to the Community-based Juvenile Services Aid Program shall be set aside for the development of a common data system at the University of Nebraska at Omaha, Juvenile Justice Institute, to assess the effectiveness of the Community-based Juvenile Services Aid Program.

Funding history for the Community-based Juvenile Services Aid Program: The FY15 appropriation for aid for the Community-based Juvenile Services Aid Program was \$4.95 million (\$50,000 was reallocated from aid to operations in the 2014 Session). For FY16, aid was increased by \$2 million to \$6.95 million, and for FY17, aid was increased by \$5 million to \$9.95 million. These increases were based on previous legislative action (LB561A, 2013). The Appropriations Committee preliminary budget recommendation includes a reallocation of \$64,216 from aid to operations so the Crime Commission could hire a hire a Fiscal Compliance Analyst to ensure that the funds are properly expended with documentation that supports the expenses. Therefore, the aid appropriation is \$6,885,784 for FY16 and \$9,885,784 for FY17.

This funding history is noted to explain the different amounts used by NACO (\$5 million) and the University of Nebraska (\$6.95 million and \$9.95 million in FY16 and FY17, respectively).

The Nebraska Crime Commission is responsible for building a system with which to collect community-based services for juvenile (approximately \$500,000).

UNO IS&T creates a database system to manage the data. The Juvenile Justice Institute (JJI) provides training for all agencies to use the system and validates the data collected.

JJI provides program evaluation and includes other evaluation for selected programs.

Funding provided includes one-time and ongoing costs.

LB 13 would modify the Community-based Juvenile Services Aid Program by allocating 10 percent of the annual General Fund appropriation to the Community-based Juvenile Services Aid Program to be used for a database at the University of Nebraska at Omaha, Juvenile Justice Institute. Pursuant to 43-2404.03, the Legislature intends to appropriate five million dollars to this program. Enactment of this legislation would therefore result in \$500,000 being reduced from the amount provided to community-based (county and Tribes) aid programs.
