This bill would create the offense of rehoming a child, which is the act of selling, transferring, or arranging for the sale or transfer of a child. The offense of rehoming a child is guilty of a Class IV felony.

The Department of Correctional Services (DCS) estimates that this bill will not significantly impact them.

As of January 31, 2015, the inmate prison population was almost 160% of design capacity. On January 31, 2014, the inmate prison population was almost 155% of design capacity.

For every inmate, the Department of Correctional Services (DCS) incurs per diem costs. The FY14 per diem cost for an individual inmate was \$7,124 per year. This is the cost for food, medical care, inmate wages, clothing, cleaning supplies, food service supplies, cell and dorm supplies, other supplies, and transportation.

Explanation of Estimate:

LB 302 creates the offense of rehoming a child. NDCS does not expect a fiscal impact from LB 302 as the number of likely convictions under this statute is very small. There is the possibility that individuals would be charged under the new provision instead of Abandonment of a spouse, child or dependent stepchild, which could result in longer lengths of stay due to the lower penalty class for Abandonment (Class I Misdemeanor vs Class IV felony). This would not have a significant impact on the Department, however, as NDCS has not held anyone with Abandonment of a spouse, child or dependent stepchild since 2002.
