Explanation of Estimate:

LB 242 would appropriate funds for the recruitment of students who study to become behavioral health professionals. Training would be carried out by the University of Nebraska, in a collaborative consultation arrangement with the Nebraska Department of Correctional Services (DCS). The program will be administered by the Behavioral Health Education Center of Nebraska (BHECN). The main focus will be promoting development of trainees learning evidence-based approaches to behavioral health assessment and treatment within correctional services with the trainees providing direct services to inmates under the clinical supervision of DCS professionals or faculty from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln (UNL) (Clinical Psychology Training Program) or University of Nebraska Medical Center (UNMC). Both training programs have faculty experienced in public sector service delivery, including correctional and forensic populations. Trainees would come from Psychiatric Nursing, Licensed Alcohol and Drug Abuse Counselors (LADCs), Physician Assistants (PAs), Social Work, Psychiatry Residents, and Psychology (Doctoral and Masters levels).
