LB516 amends §79-2,143 & §79-3106 to increase school safety across Nebraska.

Regionally focused school security specialists will be hired as employees within the Nebraska Department of Education (NDE) & will be placed to assist schools & to increase the availability of training, provide tailored technical support for the unique needs of each region, & serve as a central point of contact for school districts. The new employees will be placed under the direction of the state school security director.

Beginning in FY2024-25, the School Safety & Security Reporting System Act will be funded using General Funds. The Commissioner of Education will create & administer a grant program to the districts for security-related infrastructure projects. The projects can include, but are not limited to, surveillance equipment, door-locking systems, & double-entry doors for school buildings. Depending on available funds, NDE will provide a grant to any district that applies for a grant for use on qualifying projects. The amount of the grant will be a proportionate share of the total amount appropriated for these grants. A district's share will be based on the percentage of students attending the district according to the most recent enrollment data collected by NDE.

NDE will create & administer a grant program to provide funding to hire mental health practitioners & school psychologists to provide access to mental & behavioral health supports to students at school & within the community.

A local public health department or an educational service unit (ESU) can apply to NDE for a grant to hire a mental health practitioner or school psychologist to provide mental & behavioral health supports to students & serve as a liaison to the districts within the area served by the local public health department or ESU.

TECHINCAL NOTE:

LB516 does not clarify regions nor the number of school security specialists that NDE is to hire.

EXPENDITURES:

LB516 states the intent for the Legislature to appropriate fifteen million dollars from the General Fund to NDE to administer the School Safety & Security Reporting System Act grant program.

LB516 states the intent for the Legislature to appropriate five million dollars from the General Fund to NDE to mental & behavioral health grant program.

NDE estimates that each School Security Specialist hired would have a total cost \$117,268 for FY23-24 & \$115,832 for FY24-25.

COMMENTS: Unable to provide comment on the fiscal impact for regional specialists as no detail was provided. The amounts suggested for one employee appears to be reasonable.

Agree with the agency estimate for the School Safety and Security Reporting Act. The agency requested funding for this activity as part of the agency 2023-2025 biennial budget request and indicated the cost to be \$1.8 million for the two years of the budget.

Agree with the agency that the bill provides intent to appropriate \$20 million General Fund dollars for two new grant programs. Disagree with the agency that this funding would be for more than one year as the bill does not provide for continuing funding.

No basis to disagree with the agency statement that administrating the new grants can be done using existing resources of the agency.

Technical Note: The current appropriation language in the bill is not sufficient to create an appropriation. The fiscal impact assessment assumes an accompanying A-bill articulating appropriation in accordance with §49-804.
