LB638 creates & adopts the Nebraska K-12 Cybersecurity & Data Protection Act.

The Nebraska K-12 Cybersecurity & Data Protection Act will promote & institute protective cybersecurity measures in alignment with best practices which address prevention, mitigation, response, recovery, & establish systematized response relating to cybersecurity & data protection within the Nebraska school system.

The Educational Service Unit Coordinating Council (ESUCC) will establish a cybersecurity team to conduct a statewide needs analysis to determine appropriate cybersecurity measures & work to implement the cybersecurity measures with individual educational service units (ESUs) & schools in a manner that is respectful of each ESUs regional relationship with its member schools.

The ESUCC will annually submit a written report electronically to the Education Committee of the Legislature providing updates on progress in implementing the Nebraska K-12 Cybersecurity & Data Protection Act. The report will include updates on the level of adoption of identified cybersecurity practices in public school districts based on aggregated data from ESUs, & will include recommendations for additional provisions to address & mitigate emerging, cybersecurity threats to schools.

The State Board of Education can adopt & promulgate rules & regulations to carry out the Act. The Commissioner can take any enforcement action under the Commissioner's authority to enforce compliance with the Act.

EXPENDITURES:

The Nebraska Department of Education (NDE) estimates that there will be no fiscal impact for them.

The ESUCC estimates the costs to implement LB638 to be \$1,556,250 for FY23-24 & \$1,596,500 for FY24-25. Those expenses include 7 new FTEs, an online, ongoing training program/software, multi-factor authentication, & estimated costs for response & recover efforts in the event of a security breach.
