LB1252 amends §79-2607 to change provisions relating to the Nebraska Reading Improvement Act.

The Nebraska Department of Education (NDE) will develop & implement a professional learning system to help provide sustained professional learning & training regarding evidence-based reading instruction for teachers who teach students in kindergarten through third grade at an approved or accredited school & teachers employed by an early childhood education program approved by the State Board of Education.

NDE will work with Educational Service Units (ESUs) to enable them to provide to approved or accredited elementary schools regional coaches who are equipped to provide assistance & job-embedded training regarding evidence-based reading instruction to teachers who teach students in kindergarten through third grade. The regional coaches will be deployed in a manner that enables the coaches to spend a majority of the time at schools & in classrooms with the greatest need for improvement in reading based upon the accountability system.

NDE will, as practicable, explore partnerships with postsecondary educational institutions relating to the development of the professional learning system & training for teachers who instruct students in kindergarten through third grade in reading regarding evidence-based reading instruction & the science of reading.

EXPENDITURES:

There is intent to appropriate \$10,000,000 from the General Fund for FY2024-25 & each year thereafter to NDE to provide regional coaches & training regarding evidence-based reading instruction.

NDE estimates the need for an additional FTE to coordinate & facilitate the program. For FY2024-25, the FTE will have salary/benefits expense of \$117,273; operating expenses of \$21,592; & travel expenses of \$9,668. For FY2025-26, the FTE will have salary/benefits expense of \$120,792; operating expenses of \$22,240; & travel expenses of \$9,958.

Remaining funds appropriated to NDE will be used to pay for increased expenses to ESUs.

For FY2024-25, the Educational Service Unit Coordinating Council (ESUCC) estimates the need to add 37 FTEs across the seventeen ESUs in Nebraska. The FTEs will have a salary/benefits expense of \$3,700,000; & travel expenses of \$50,000. For FY2025-26, the number of FTEs needed increases to 74. The FTEs will have a salary/benefits expense of \$7,622,000; & travel expenses of \$100,000.

The intent is to appropriation General Funds to the Department of Education who would in turn pay for the services called for in the bill. The state does not directly appropriation funds to the ESUs.
