Explanation of Estimate:

The bill requires increase of the Department's budget and spending authority by \$20,000,000. The bill expresses intent to appropriate \$20,000,000 of federal ARPA funds to the Department through Program 314 (Critical Infrastructure Facilities Program) and requires its dispersal through a grant to an eligible city of the first class located in a county with less than twenty thousand inhabitants which is located in a metropolitan statistical area, as defined in section 18-803, with more than three hundred thousand inhabitants for the purpose of funding a portion of the cost of a wastewater system. The Department does not foresee an increase in administrative expenditures nor the need for additional staffing, thus no foreseeable fiscal impact.

Water infrastructure projects such as those relating to wastewater systems, as proposed by the bill, are complex and take time to develop and implement. Therefore, the expenditure is shown split between FY 2024-2025 and FY 2025-26.
