This bill would provide for the regulation of adult and sexually oriented businesses. The bill provides for a Class I misdemeanor (0-1 year) for certain violations of the act.

The provisions of this bill could impact state and local criminal justice resources (law enforcement, prosecutors, public defenders, probation, jails, prisons, etc.). It is unknown how many individuals would violate the provisions of this bill, and therefore, it will have an indeterminate impact on criminal justice expenditures.

Some people convicted of a Class I misdemeanor could end up in the Department of Correctional Services (DCS) facilities. DCS states that since these are new offenses, it is unknown how many individuals might be incarcerated for such offenses. It is also unknown how many of the convictions would be for the term of one year and would serve their sentence in the State prison system. The fiscal impact is not determinable.

The State Patrol estimates no fiscal impact.
