This bill makes various changes to health regulations and incorporates the provisions of LB 132, LB 220, LB 451, LB 515 and LB 341.

Licensing of barbers, barber shops and barber schools is changed from an annual license to a biennial license. The change in the licensing process will increase revenue in FY 11 by \$251,460 and decrease revenue by the same amount in FY 12, the first year the biennial license is in effect. Saving in printing and postage is estimated to be \$1,688 in FY 12.

This bill authorizes the Department of Health and Human Services to pay for drug and medical care to prevent the spread of tuberculosis and for the evaluation and diagnosis of persons who have been identified as contacts of a person with communicable tuberculosis. As the language permits the department to pay for evaluations and diagnosis but does not mandate coverage, there is no fiscal impact.
