LB 691 would provide to the Real Estate Commission the authority to impose sanctions on persons who are acting as a real estate broker or salesperson without the proper license. These sanctions range from a cease and desist order, to a fine of up to \$1,000 per day or the amount of all money earned as a commission, whichever is greater.

Any fine revenue generated by the imposition of sanctions will accrue to the local public schools. The amount of which cannot be forecast since the number of violations in any year is highly variable, the number of individuals who voluntarily follow a cease and desist order so as to avoid the imposition of a fine is unknown, the amount of the fine can vary in each case, etc..

The Real Estate Commission has indicated in their fiscal note that any expenditures related to enforcement would be dependent upon the type and number of such prosecutions, which would be highly variable. They indicate they can absorb any additional expenditures within their existing cash fund appropriation and I concur with this assessment.
