LB 831 authorizes the issuance of a school permit to a person between the ages of 14 to 16 years and three months, if such person lives 1.5 miles or more from the school of attendance, resides in a first class city, and has held a learner's permit for two months.

There are currently thirty first class cities in the state. It is assumed there will be an increase in the number of school permits issued to persons in these cities. The increased number of school permits which will be issued pursuant to the bill is unknown.

An increase in the number of school permits issued will increase the workload of counties and the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) to issue such permits. It is assumed any increase in workload can be absorbed with existing local and state resources.

Applicants for a school permit pay a \$10.50 fee which is allocated to the DMV Cash Fund (\$7.50); the state General Fund (\$2.75); and, the county of issuance (\$.25). Increased revenue will be received by these entities based upon the number of school permits issued pursuant to the bill.
