Re: Overdue Regulations Report

Overview

By law, state agencies subject to the Administrative Procedure Act (APA) are required to report the status of regulations that are required by statute ("mandatory regulations") to the Legislative Audit Office by July 1 each year.¹ Additionally, for regulations not developed within three years of a bills effective date, the law requires the relevant legislative standing committee to hold a public hearing on the regulations.

2019 Report

We received reports from all agencies. Two agencies reported overdue mandatory regulations. Those reports were sent to the chairpersons of standing committees with jurisdiction and to the Appropriations Committee if they reported a related appropriation. Attached is a chart indicating the status of all reports the Audit Office received this year. Individual reports from agencies reporting overdue regulations are attached to this memorandum.

¹ Agencies are governed by the APA if they have the authority to make rules and regulations. The Legislature, Commission on Industrial Relations, Nebraska Workers' Compensation Court, and the Adjutant General's Office are not considered agencies under the Act. The Secretary of State is considered an agency, except when carrying out the requirements of the APA. The Parole Board may be considered an agency, but it is specifically exempt from the APA under Neb. Rev. Stat. § 83-199.
