### Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 144 is a reintroduction of LB 891 (2006). The bill adopts the Hepatitis C Education and Prevention Act (act). The act terminates on December 31, 2007.

Section 2 creates the Hepatitis C Education and Prevention Task Force (task force) consisting of 18 members.

Section 3 requires appointment of task force members on or before May 1, 2007. The chairperson of the Health and Human Services Committee of the Legislature or his or her representative is designated as chairperson of the task force. The Health and Human Services Committee is required to provide research and administrative support to the task force. For budgetary purposes, the task force is placed within the Legislative Council.

Section 4 provides for meetings of the task force at the call of the chairperson and authorizes reimbursement of task force members for necessary expenses.

Section 5 provides duties for the task force. The task force is required to "develop a comprehensive strategic plan to address the increasing epidemic of hepatitis C in Nebraska." Contents of the plan are prescribed.

Section 6 requires the task force to report on its activities and recommendations for policies and potential legislation to the Governor and the Health and Human Services Committee on or before December 31, 2007.

Section 7 contains an emergency clause.

## **Explanation of amendments, if any:**

The committee amendment (AM 297) is a technical amendment that revises provisions relating to the appointment of members to the Hepatitis C Education and Prevention Task Force. The amendment clarifies the Governor's obligation to appoint certain members of the task force. The amendment also provides that task force members must be appointed within 30 days after the effective date of the bill. The bill as introduced required that members be appointed by May 1, 2007.
