LB 534 would allow a city or county required by federal law to have its own storm water management program to adopt a system of storm water management charges against real property and to issue bonds to pay for the construction of a storm sewer system and the development of a storm water management program. The impact to political subdivisions subject to federal storm water management guidelines will depend upon the cost of local projects and the financing methods chosen by the subdivisions, and will vary on a case-by-case basis.

Because LB 534 directs cities and counties to establish a system for exemption from storm water charges for property of the state and its governmental subdivisions, it is estimated that any impact to state agencies as a result of LB 534 would be minimal. It is estimated that the provisions of LB 534 would not have a significant impact on the Storm Water Management Plan Program in the Department of Environmental Quality.
