This bill, as amended, would have the Crime Commission examine firearm-related violence in Nebraska. The examination includes a list of items the Commission will have to examine. The amended bill also repeals handgun purchase permits.

The following points are a summary of the reasons for the estimated expenditure impact to the State Patrol:

- Handgun purchase permits are done by the local sheriff or police
- Repealing these permits will require NICS gun check run with each purchase of a handgun
- NSP will be contacted on each instance in which a fingerprint based arrest has occurred for complete disposition information
- These arrests cover approximately 128,000 subjects
- This is a drastic workload increase

The amended bill requires the Crime Commission to examine firearm-related violence in Nebraska. The Crime Commission notes that most of the items to be examined are not included in data they currently collect. The commission is not aware of it being collected by other agencies in a comprehensive manner. Therefore, the Crime Commission will have to contract out this study and based on past experience contracting out studies, they estimate a cost of \$45,000.
