4		Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 37-407, 37-426,
5		37-427, 37-431, 37-447, 37-450, 37-452, and 37-457,
6		Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2006; to change
7		provisions relating to licenses, permits, stamps, and
8		fees; to provide for a lifetime Nebraska migratory
9		waterfowl stamp; to prohibit trapping in the county road
10		right-of-way; to change and eliminate provisions relating
11		to hunting wild turkey; to provide for the revocation and
12		suspension of permits for trapping in the county road
13		right-of-way; to rename a fund; to harmonize provisions;

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1 and to repeal the original sections.

2 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 37-406, Reissue Revised Statutes of
 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 37-406 (1) Licenses, permits, and stamps required under the Game Law shall be issued by the commission and may be procured 4 5 from the secretary of the commission. The commission may provide for the electronic issuance of any license, permit, or stamp 6 7 required under the Game Law and may enter into contracts to procure 8 necessary services and supplies for the electronic issuance of 9 licenses, permits, and stamps. Except for permits issued under 10 sections 37-462 and 37-463, the commission may provide for the 11 issuance of any license, permit, or stamp required under the Game 12 Law in the form of a number which identifies the holder in the 13 records of the commission. The commission may designate itself 14 and other persons, firms, and corporations as agents to issue 15 licenses, permits, and stamps and collect the prescribed fees. Any 16 The commission and any person, firm, or corporation, $\frac{1}{2}$ other than 17 the secretary of the commission or an employee of the commission, 18 authorized by the commission to issue licenses, permits, and stamps 19 shall be entitled to collect and retain an additional fee of not 20 less than fifty cents and not more than one dollar, as established 21 by the commission pursuant to section 37-327, two dollars, for each 22 license, permit, or stamp issued as reimbursement for the clerical work of issuing the license, permit, or stamp and collecting and 23 24 remitting the fees.

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(2) The commission shall adopt and promulgate rules and

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regulations regarding electronic issuance of licenses, permits, and stamps, including electronic issuance devices, deposits by agents, and remittance of fees. The commission may provide for the electronic issuance of a license, permit, or stamp by acknowledging the purchase of such license, permit, or stamp without requiring a physical license, permit, or stamp or facsimile of such.

7 (3) It shall be unlawful for any person to duplicate 8 any electronically issued license, permit, or stamp. Any person 9 violating this subsection shall be guilty of a Class III 10 misdemeanor and shall be fined at least seventy-five dollars, and 11 any license, permit, or stamp involved in such violation shall be 12 confiscated by the court.

Sec. 2. Section 37-407, Revised Statutes Cumulative
Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

15 37-407 The commission may offer multiple-year permits or 16 combinations of permits at reduced rates and may establish fees pursuant to section 37-327 to be paid to the state for resident 17 and nonresident hunting permits, annual fishing permits, three-day 18 19 fishing permits, one-day fishing permits, combination hunting and 20 fishing permits, fur-harvesting permits, and nonresident special 21 two-day hunting permits issued for periods of two consecutive days 22 between the fourth Wednesday in November Wednesday immediately preceding Thanksgiving Day and December 31 of the same calendar 23 24 year and limited to one special two-day permit per applicant per 25 year, as follows:

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(1) Resident fees shall be (a) not less than eleven 1 2 dollars and not more than thirteen dollars for hunting, (b) not 3 less than fifteen dollars and not more than seventeen dollars and fifty cents for fishing, (c) not less than ten dollars and not more 4 5 than eleven dollars and fifty cents for a three-day fishing permit, 6 (d) not less than five dollars and not more than eight dollars for 7 a one-day fishing permit, (e) not less than twenty-five dollars and 8 not more than twenty-nine dollars for both fishing and hunting, and 9 (f) not less than fifteen dollars and not more than twenty dollars 10 for fur harvesting; and

11 (2) Nonresident fees shall be (a) not less than resident 12 fees and not more than two hundred sixty dollars for a period of 13 time specified by the commission for fur harvesting one thousand 14 or less fur-bearing animals and not less than fifteen dollars 15 additional and not more than seventeen dollars and fifty cents additional for each one hundred or part of one hundred fur-bearing 16 17 animals harvested, (b)(i) for persons sixteen years of age and 18 older, not less than sixty-seven dollars and not more than eighty dollars for hunting and (ii) for persons under sixteen years of 19 20 age, not less than the fee required pursuant to subdivision (1)(a) 21 of this section for hunting, (c) not less than twenty-five dollars 22 and not more than thirty-five dollars for a special two-day hunting 23 permit plus the cost of a habitat stamp, (d) not less than six 24 dollars and not more than nine dollars for a one-day fishing 25 permit, (e) not less than fourteen dollars and not more than

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sixteen dollars and fifty cents for a three-day fishing permit,
 and (f) not less than forty dollars and not more than forty-nine
 dollars and fifty cents for an annual fishing permit.

Sec. 3. Section 37-414, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

6 37-414 (1) The commission shall establish and administer 7 a bow hunter education program consisting of a minimum of (a) 8 ten hours of classroom instruction or (b) independent study on 9 the part of the student sufficient to pass an examination given 10 by the commission followed by such student's participation in a 11 minimum of four hours of practical instruction. The program shall 12 provide instruction in the safe use of bow hunting equipment, the 13 fundamentals of bow hunting, shooting and hunting techniques, game 14 identification, conservation management, and hunter ethics. When 15 establishing such a program, the commission shall train volunteers 16 as bow hunter education training instructors. The commission shall 17 issue a certificate of successful completion to any person who 18 satisfactorily completes a bow hunter education program established by the commission and shall print, purchase, or otherwise acquire 19 20 materials necessary for effective program operation. The commission 21 shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations for carrying out 22 and administering such program.

(2) A person born on or after January 1, 1977, who is
hunting antelope, deer, elk, <u>or mountain sheep</u>, or wild turkey with
a bow and arrow pursuant to any provision of sections 37-447 to

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1 37-453 and 37-457 shall have on his or her person a bow hunter 2 education certificate of successful completion issued by his or 3 her state or province of residence or a bow hunter education 4 certificate issued by an accredited program recognized by the 5 commission.

6 Sec. 4. Section 37-426, Revised Statutes Cumulative
7 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

8 37-426 (1) Except as provided in subsection (4) of this
9 section:

10 (a) No resident of Nebraska sixteen years of age or 11 older and no nonresident of Nebraska regardless of age shall 12 hunt, harvest, or possess any game bird, upland game bird, game 13 animal, or fur-bearing animal unless, at the time of such hunting, harvesting, or possessing, such person has an unexpired habitat 14 15 stamp as prescribed by the rules and regulations of the commission 16 prior to the time of hunting, harvesting, or possessing such bird 17 or animal;

18 (b) No resident or nonresident of Nebraska shall take or possess any aquatic organism requiring a Nebraska fishing permit, 19 20 including any fish, bullfrog, snapping turtle, tiger salamander, 21 or mussel, unless, at the time of such taking or possessing, such 22 person has an unexpired aquatic habitat stamp as prescribed by the 23 rules and regulations of the commission prior to the time of taking or possessing a fish, bullfrog, snapping turtle, tiger salamander, 24 25 or mussel; and

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(c) No resident of Nebraska sixteen years of age or 1 2 older and no nonresident of Nebraska regardless of age shall hunt, 3 harvest, or possess any migratory waterfowl unless, at the time of such hunting, harvesting, or possessing, such person has an 4 5 unexpired Nebraska migratory waterfowl stamp as prescribed by the 6 rules and regulations of the commission prior to the time of 7 hunting, harvesting, or possessing such migratory waterfowl. 8 (2) (2) (a) The commission may issue a lifetime habitat 9 stamp upon application and payment of the appropriate fee. The fee 10 for a lifetime habitat stamp shall be twenty times the fee required 11 in subsection (5) of this section for an annual habitat stamps. 12 stamp. Payment of such fee shall be made in a lump sum at the time 13 of application. A replacement lifetime habitat stamp may be issued 14 if the original is lost or destroyed. The fee for a replacement 15 shall be not less than one dollar and fifty cents and not more than 16 five dollars, as established by the commission. 17 (b) The commission may issue a lifetime Nebraska

18 migratory waterfowl stamp upon application and payment of the appropriate fee. The fee for a lifetime Nebraska migratory 19 20 waterfowl stamp shall be twenty times the fee required in 21 subsection (5) of this section for an annual Nebraska migratory 22 waterfowl stamp. Payment of such fee shall be made in a lump sum at 23 the time of application. A replacement Nebraska lifetime migratory 24 waterfowl stamp may be issued if the original is lost or destroyed. 25 The fee for a replacement shall be not less than one dollar and

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1 <u>fifty cents and not more than five dollars, as established by the</u> 2 commission.

3 (3) The commission may issue a lifetime aquatic habitat stamp upon application and payment of the appropriate fee. The 4 5 fee for a lifetime aquatic habitat stamp shall be not less than seventy-five dollars and not more than one hundred twenty-five 6 7 dollars as established by the commission pursuant to section 8 37-327. Payment of such fee shall be made in a lump sum at the time 9 of application. A lifetime aquatic habitat stamp shall not be made 10 invalid by reason of the holder subsequently residing outside the 11 state. A replacement lifetime aquatic habitat stamp may be issued 12 if the original is lost or destroyed. The fee for a replacement 13 shall not be less than one dollar and fifty cents and not more than 14 five dollars, as established by the commission.

15 (4) Habitat stamps are not required for holders of 16 limited permits issued under section 37-455. Aquatic habitat stamps are not required (a) when a fishing permit is not required, 17 18 (b) for holders of permits pursuant to section 37-424, or (c) 19 for holders of lifetime fishing permits or lifetime combination 20 hunting and fishing permits purchased prior to January 1, 2006. 21 Nebraska migratory waterfowl stamps are not required for hunting, 22 harvesting, or possessing any species other than ducks, geese, or 23 brant. For purposes of this section, a showing of proof of the electronic issuance of a stamp by the commission shall fulfill the 24 25 requirements of this section.

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1 (5) Any person to whom a stamp has been issued shall, 2 immediately upon request, exhibit evidence of issuance of the 3 stamp to any officer. Any person hunting, fishing, harvesting, or possessing any game bird, upland game bird, game animal, or 4 5 fur-bearing animal or any aquatic organism requiring a fishing permit in this state without evidence of issuance of the 6 7 appropriate stamp shall be deemed to be without such stamp. A 8 habitat stamp shall be issued upon the payment of a fee of not 9 less than thirteen dollars and not more than sixteen dollars per 10 stamp. An aquatic habitat stamp shall be issued in conjunction 11 with each fishing permit for a fee of not less than five dollars 12 and not more than seven dollars and fifty cents per stamp for 13 annual fishing permits, three-day fishing permits, or combination 14 hunting and fishing permits and a fee of not less than seventy-five 15 dollars and not more than one hundred dollars for lifetime fishing 16 or combination hunting and fishing permits. The fee established 17 under section 37-407 for a one-day fishing permit shall include an 18 aquatic habitat stamp. One dollar from the sale of each one-day 19 fishing permit shall be remitted to the State Treasurer for 20 credit to the Nebraska Aquatic Habitat Fund. A Nebraska migratory 21 waterfowl stamp shall be issued upon the payment of a fee of not 22 less than five dollars and not more than ten dollars per stamp. The 23 commission shall establish the fees pursuant to section 37-327. Sec. 5. Section 37-427, Revised Statutes Cumulative 24

25 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

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37-427 The habitat stamp, aquatic habitat stamp, or 1 2 Nebraska migratory waterfowl stamp required by section 37-426 is 3 not transferable and, except for the lifetime habitat stamp, the lifetime aquatic habitat stamp, the lifetime Nebraska migratory 4 5 waterfowl stamp, and a habitat stamp purchased for a permit which is valid into the next calendar year, expires at midnight on 6 7 December 31 in the year for which the stamp is issued. 8 Sec. 6. Section 37-431, Revised Statutes Cumulative 9 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read: 10 37-431 (1) (a) The Nebraska Habitat Fund is created. 11 The commission shall remit fees received for habitat stamps and 12 Nebraska migratory waterfowl stamps to the State Treasurer for 13 credit to the Nebraska Habitat Fund. Any money in the fund 14 available for investment shall be invested by the state investment 15 officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the 16 Nebraska State Funds Investment Act. No expenditure shall be made from the Nebraska Habitat Fund until the commission has presented a 17 18 habitat plan to the Committee on Appropriations of the Legislature 19 for its approval.

(b) Fees received for lifetime habitat stamps <u>and</u> <u>lifetime Nebraska migratory waterfowl stamps</u> shall be credited to the Nebraska Habitat Fund and shall not be expended but may be invested by the state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act. Income from such investments may be expended by the commission

2 (2) (a) The Nebraska Aquatic Habitat Fund is created. The 3 commission shall remit fees received for aquatic habitat stamps and one dollar of the one-day fishing permit fee as provided in section 4 5 37-426 to the State Treasurer for credit to the Nebraska Aquatic Habitat Fund. Any money in the fund available for investment 6 7 shall be invested by the state investment officer pursuant to 8 the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds 9 Investment Act. No expenditure shall be made from the Nebraska 10 Aquatic Habitat Fund until the commission has presented a habitat 11 plan to the Committee on Appropriations and the Committee on 12 Natural Resources of the Legislature for their approval.

(b) Fees received for lifetime aquatic habitat stamps shall be credited to the Nebraska Aquatic Habitat Fund and shall not be expended but may be invested by the state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act. Income from such investments may be expended by the commission pursuant to section 37-432.

(3) The secretary of the commission and any county clerk or public official designated to sell habitat stamps, aquatic habitat stamps, or Nebraska migratory waterfowl stamps shall be liable upon their official bonds or equivalent commercial insurance policy for failure to remit the money from the sale of the stamps, as required by sections 37-426 to 37-433, coming into their hands. Any agent who receives stamp fees and who fails to remit the

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fees to the commission within a reasonable time after demand by the commission shall be liable to the commission in damages for double the amount of the funds wrongfully withheld. Any agent who purposefully fails to remit such fees with the intention of converting them is guilty of theft. The penalty for such violation

6 shall be determined by the amount converted as specified in section7 28-518.

8 Sec. 7. Section 37-447, Revised Statutes Cumulative
9 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

10 37-447 (1) The commission may issue permits for the 11 hunting of deer and prescribe and establish regulations and 12 limitations for the hunting, transportation, and possession 13 of deer. The commission may offer multiple-year permits or 14 combinations of permits at reduced rates. The commission 15 may specify by regulation the information to be required on 16 applications for such permits. Regulations and limitations for the 17 hunting, transportation, and possession of deer may include, but 18 not be limited to, regulations and limitations as to the type, 19 caliber, and other specifications of firearms and ammunition used 20 and specifications for bows and arrows used. Such regulations and 21 limitations may further specify and limit the method of hunting 22 deer and may provide for dividing the state into management units 23 or areas, and the commission may enact different deer hunting 24 regulations for the different management units pertaining to sex, 25 species, and age of the deer hunted.

1	(2) The number of such permits may be limited as provided
2	by the rules and regulations of the commission, and except as
3	provided in section 37-454, the permits shall be disposed of in
4	an impartial manner. Whenever the commission deems it advisable to
5	limit the number of permits issued for any or all management units,
6	the commission shall, by rules and regulations, determine who shall
7	be eligible to obtain such permits. In establishing eligibility,
8	the commission may give preference to persons who did not receive a
9	permit during the previous year or years.
10	(3) Such permits may be issued to allow deer hunting in
11	the Nebraska National Forest and other game reserves and such other

12 areas as the commission may designate whenever the commission deems 13 that permitting such hunting will not be detrimental to the proper 14 preservation of wildlife in Nebraska in such forest, reserves, or 15 areas.

16 (4) The commission shall, pursuant to section 37-327, 17 establish and charge a fee of not more than twenty-nine dollars 18 for residents and not more than two hundred fourteen dollars for 19 nonresidents for each permit issued under this section, except that 20 the fee for a statewide buck-only permit shall be two and one-half 21 times the amount of a regular deer permit.

(5) The commission may issue nonresident permits after preference has been given for the issuance of resident permits as provided in rules and regulations adopted and promulgated by the commission. The commission may require a predetermined application

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period for permit applications in specified management units. Such 1 2 permits shall be issued after a reasonable period for making 3 application, as established by the commission, has expired. When more valid applications are received for a designated management 4 5 unit than there are permits available, such permits shall be allocated on the basis of a random drawing. All valid applications 6 7 received during the predetermined application period shall be 8 considered equally in any such random drawing without regard to 9 time of receipt of such applications by the commission.

12 37-449 The commission may issue permits for hunting 13 antelope and may establish separate and, when necessary, different 14 regulations therefor within the limitations prescribed in sections 15 37-447 and 37-452 for hunting deer. The commission may offer multiple-year permits or combinations of permits at reduced rates. 16 The commission may, pursuant to section 37-327, establish and 17 18 charge a nonrefundable application fee of not less than five 19 dollars and not more than seven dollars. The commission shall, 20 pursuant to section 37-327, establish and charge a fee of not 21 less than twenty-five dollars and not more than twenty-nine dollars 22 for residents and not less than one hundred thirty dollars and 23 not more than one hundred forty-nine dollars and fifty cents 24 for nonresidents for each permit issued under this section. The 25 provisions for the distribution of deer permits and the authority

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of the commission to determine eligibility of applicants for
 permits as described in sections 37-447 and 37-452 shall also apply
 to the distribution of antelope permits.

Sec. 9. Section 37-450, Revised Statutes Cumulative
Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

6 37-450 The commission may issue permits for hunting 7 elk and may establish separate and, when necessary, different 8 regulations therefor within the limitations prescribed in sections 9 37-447 and 37-452 for hunting deer. Permits to hunt elk issued 10 pursuant to this section shall not be issued to nonresidents. The 11 commission shall, pursuant to section 37-327, establish and charge 12 a nonrefundable application fee of not less than seven dollars 13 and not more than eight dollars and fifty cents and a fee of 14 not less than one hundred thirty dollars and not more than one 15 hundred forty-nine dollars and fifty cents for each elk permit 16 issued. A person may obtain only one antlered-elk permit in his or 17 her lifetime except for a limited permit to hunt elk pursuant to 18 section 37-455. The provisions for the distribution of deer permits 19 and the authority of the commission to determine eligibility of 20 applicants for permits as described in sections 37-447 and 37-452 21 shall also apply to the distribution of elk permits.

37-452 No person shall be issued a permit to hunt deer,
antelope, elk, wild turkey, or mountain sheep unless such person

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is at least twelve years of age, except that any person who is
 twelve through fifteen years of age shall only hunt deer, antelope,
 elk, wild turkey, or mountain sheep when accompanied by a person
 twenty-one years of age or over having a valid hunting permit.

5 Sec. 11. Section 37-457, Revised Statutes Cumulative
6 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

7 37-457 (1) The commission may issue permits for hunting 8 wild turkey and prescribe and establish regulations and limitations 9 for the hunting, transportation, and possession of wild turkey. 10 The commission may offer multiple-year permits or combinations of 11 permits at reduced rates. The number of such permits may be limited 12 as provided by the regulations of the commission, but the permits 13 shall be disposed of in an impartial manner. Such permits may be 14 issued to allow wild turkey hunting in the Nebraska National Forest 15 and other game reserves and such other areas as the commission 16 may designate whenever the commission deems that permitting such 17 hunting would not be detrimental to the proper preservation of 18 wildlife in such forest, reserves, or areas.

Permits, as 15 authorized by the commission, shall be awarded by random drawing to 16 eligible applicants. 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of a Class III misdemeanor and shall be fined at least fifty
 dollars.

3 (2) (a) It shall be unlawful to trap any wildlife in the
4 county road right-of-way.

5 (b) For purposes of this subsection, county road 6 right-of-way means the area which has been designated a part of the 7 county road system and which has not been vacated pursuant to law. 8 Sec. 14. Section 37-527, Reissue Revised Statutes of

9 Nebraska, is amended to read:

10 37-527 (1) For purposes of this section, hunter orange 11 means a daylight fluorescent orange color with a dominant wave 12 length between five hundred ninety-five and six hundred five 13 nanometers, an excitation purity of not less than eighty-five 14 percent, and a luminance factor of not less than forty percent.

15 (2) Any person hunting deer, antelope, wild turkey, elk, 16 or mountain sheep during an authorized firearm season in this state 17 shall display on his or her head, chest, and back a total of not 18 less than four hundred square inches of hunter orange material 19 except as exempted by rules and regulations of the commission.

20 (3) Any person who violates this section shall be guilty21 of a Class V misdemeanor.

37-548 (1) It shall be unlawful for any person to import 4 5 into the state or release to the wild any live wildlife including the viable gametes, eqgs or sperm, except those which are approved 6 7 by rules and regulations of the commission or as otherwise provided 8 in the Game Law. It shall be unlawful to commercially exploit or 9 export from the state any dead or live wildlife taken from the wild 10 except those which are exempted by rules and regulations of the 11 commission. Any person violating this subsection shall be guilty of 12 a Class III misdemeanor.

13 (2) The commission shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations to carry out subsection (1) of this section. 14 15 In adopting such rules and regulations, the commission shall 16 be governed by the Administrative Procedure Act. Such rules and regulations shall include a listing of (a) the wildlife which may 17 18 be released or imported into the state and (b) the wildlife taken from the wild which may be commercially exploited or exported from 19 20 the state. The rules and regulations for release, importation, 21 commercial exploitation, and exportation of species other than 22 commercial fish and bait fish shall include, but not be limited to, requirements for annual permits for release or importation or for 23 commercial exploitation or exportation, permit fees, the number of 24 25 individual animals of a particular species that may be released,

imported, collected, or exported under a permit, and the manner and location of release or collection of a particular species. The rules and regulations may be amended, modified, or repealed from time to time, based upon investigation and the best available scientific, commercial, or other reliable data.

6 (3) The commission shall establish permit fees as 7 required by subsection (2) of this section to cover the cost of 8 permit processing and enforcement of the permits and research into 9 and management of the ecological effects of release, importation, 10 commercial exploitation, and exportation. The commission shall 11 remit the fees to the State Treasurer for credit to the Nongame and 12 Endangered Species Wildlife Conservation Fund.

2 (6) The commission shall, upon its own recommendation or 3 upon the petition of any person who presents to the commission substantial evidence that commercial exploitation or exportation 4 5 will cause ecologic or economic harm or significant impact to a wildlife population, conduct a review of any listed or unlisted 6 7 species proposed to be added to or removed from the list published 8 pursuant to subdivision (2) (b) of this section. The review shall be 9 conducted pursuant to subsection (4) of this section.
