A BILL

- FOR AN ACT relating to agriculture; to amend section 54-2423,

 Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2006; to change

 inspection requirements and late fees under the Livestock

 Waste Management Act; to repeal the original section; and

 to declare an emergency.
- Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. Section 54-2423, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 3 54-2423 (1) If any person owning or operating an animal
- 4 feeding operation (a) does not hold a National Pollutant Discharge
- 5 Elimination System permit, an operating permit, or a construction
- 6 and operating permit or have construction approval, (b) has
- 7 not been notified by the department that no National Pollutant
- 8 Discharge Elimination System permit or construction and operating
- 9 permit is required, or (c) is not exempt under section 54-2422,
- 10 such person shall, on forms prescribed by the department, request
- 11 the department to inspect such person's animal feeding operation
- 12 to determine if a livestock waste control facility is required. If
- 13 an inspection is requested prior to January 1, 1999, an inspection
- 14 fee for such inspection shall not be assessed. For inspections
- 15 requested on or after July 16, 2004, there shall be an inspection
- 16 fee established by the council with a minimum fee of one hundred
- 17 dollars and a maximum fee of five hundred dollars. Such fee may be
- 18 set according to animal capacity.
- 19 (2) The department shall, in conjunction with natural
- 20 resources districts and the Cooperative Extension Service of the
- 21 University of Nebraska, publicize information to make owners and
- 22 operators of affected animal feeding operations aware of the need
- 23 to request an inspection.
- 24 (3) Any person required to request an inspection under
- 25 this section who operates an animal feeding operation after

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1 January 1, 2000, except an animal feeding operation exempted

- 2 by the department from National Pollutant Discharge Elimination
- 3 System permit requirements prior to July 16, 2004, without first
- 4 submitting the request for inspection required under this section
- 5 shall be assessed, except for good cause shown, a late fee of not
- 6 less than fifty dollars nor more than five hundred dollars for
- 7 each offense. Each month a violation continues shall constitute a
- 8 separate offense.
- 9 (3) Any person required to request an inspection under
- 10 this section who operates an animal feeding operation after January
- 11 $\frac{1}{2000}$, without first submitting the request for inspection
- 12 required under this section shall be assessed, except for good
- 13 cause shown, a late fee of not less than fifty dollars nor more
- 14 than five hundred dollars for each offense. Each month a violation
- 15 continues shall constitute a separate offense. Exceptions to this
- 16 provision are:
- 17 (a) An animal feeding operation exempted by the
- 18 department from National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System
- 19 permit requirements prior to July 16, 2004; or
- 20 (b) A livestock operation that became an animal feeding
- 21 operation by enactment of the Livestock Waste Management Act as
- 22 such act existed on July 16, 2004, but was not required to request
- 23 an inspection prior to that date.
- 24 (4) A person meeting the provisions of subdivision (3)(b)
- 25 of this section shall request an inspection prior to January 1,

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1 2009, and pay fees required pursuant to subsection (1) of this

- 2 section.
- 3 (5) Any person required to request an inspection under
- 4 subsection (4) of this section who operates an animal feeding
- 5 operation after December 31, 2008, shall be assessed, except for
- 6 good cause shown, a late fee of not less than fifty dollars nor
- 7 more than five hundred dollars for each offense. Each month a
- 8 <u>violation continues shall constitute a separate offense.</u>
- 9 Sec. 2. Original section 54-2423, Revised Statutes
- 10 Cumulative Supplement, 2006, is repealed.
- 11 Sec. 3. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
- 12 when passed and approved according to law.
