1 Section 1. Section 81-1201.21, Revised Statutes

- 2 Supplement, 2007, is amended to read:
- 3 81-1201.21 (1) There is hereby created the Job Training
- 4 Cash Fund. The fund shall be under the direction of the Department
- 5 of Economic Development. Money may be transferred to the fund
- 6 pursuant to subdivision (1)(b)(iv) of section 48-621 and from
- 7 the Cash Reserve Fund at the direction of the Legislature. The
- 8 department shall establish a subaccount for all money transferred
- 9 from the Cash Reserve Fund to the Job Training Cash Fund on or
- 10 after July 1, 2005. Any unexpended or unobligated balance remaining
- 11 within such subaccount on July 1, 2010, shall be transferred by the
- 12 State Treasurer to the Cash Reserve Fund no later than July 10,
- 13 2010. Any obligated amount not transferred from the subaccount that
- 14 remains unexpended on July 1, 2009, shall be transferred by the
- 15 State Treasurer to the Cash Reserve Fund no later than December 31,
- 16 2011.
- 17 (2) The department shall use the fund Job Training
- 18 Cash Fund to provide reimbursements for job training activities,
- 19 including employee assessment, preemployment training, on-the-job
- 20 training, training equipment costs, and other reasonable costs
- 21 related to helping industry and business locate or expand
- 22 in Nebraska, or to provide upgrade skills training of the
- 23 existing labor force necessary to adapt to new technology or the
- 24 introduction of new product lines.
- 25 (3) The department shall establish a subaccount within

1 the fund to provide job training grants targeted to small

- 2 employers, rural employers, and poverty area employers meeting
- 3 one of the following criteria: (a) Employ twenty-five or fewer
- 4 employees, (b) located in rural areas of Nebraska, or (c) located
- 5 in areas of high concentration of poverty within the corporate
- 6 limits of a city or village consisting of one or more contiguous
- 7 census tracts, as determined by the most recent federal decennial
- 8 census, which contain a percentage of persons below the poverty
- 9 line of greater than thirty percent, and all census tracts
- 10 contiguous to such tract or tracts, as determined by the most
- 11 recent federal decennial census. The department shall calculate the
- 12 amount of prior year investment income earnings accruing to the
- 13 fund and allocate such amount to the subaccount for small, rural,
- 14 or poverty area employer grants.
- 15 (4) Any money in the fund available for investment
- 16 shall be invested by the state investment officer pursuant to
- 17 the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska State Funds
- 18 Investment Act.
- 19 Sec. 2. Section 81-1202, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 20 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 21 81-1202 For purposes of sections 81-1202 to 81-1210 and
- 22 section 3 of this act, job training grant means a grant from the
- 23 Job Training Cash Fund or any nonfederal funding source within the
- 24 Department of Economic Development awarded by the department.
- 25 Sec. 3. Whenever practicable, the Department of Economic

1 Development shall give priority consideration to training services

- 2 offered by community college areas.
- 3 Sec. 4. Section 81-1205, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 4 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 5 81-1205 A business which is awarded a job training
- 6 grant shall provide annual performance reports to the Department
- 7 of Economic Development and a final performance report upon the
- 8 completion of the project. The department shall provide an annual
- 9 report by December 1 of each year to the Appropriations Committee
- 10 of the Legislature. The report shall include information on each
- 11 active grant, including specific information regarding the number
- 12 of positions to be trained, whether new or existing employees
- 13 are to be trained, the length of time that the project has
- 14 been active, the amount of funding committed to the project, the
- 15 amount of funding paid out to date, and the projected completion
- 16 date. The report shall also provide information on grants closed
- during the reporting year, including the total number of employees
- 18 trained, whether new or existing employees were trained, total
- 19 project expenditures, and the duration time of the project. The
- 20 department shall also provide information summarizing the use of
- 21 community college areas to provide training services and list
- 22 specific projects where a community college area is providing
- 23 all or a component of the training services. If private or
- 24 inhouse training services are used, the department shall provide
- 25 information regarding the name of the private or inhouse training

- service and the qualifications of the training service.
