## A BILL

1	FOR AN	ACT relating to gambling; to amend sections 71-816 and
2		71-817, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2006,
3		and section 9-812, Revised Statutes Supplement, 2007; to
4		change provisions relating to the distribution of the
5		State Lottery Operation Trust Fund and the use of the
6		Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund; to state intent; to
7		rename and change powers and duties of the State Advisory
8		Committee on Problem Gambling and Addiction Services;
9		to repeal the original sections; and to declare an
LO		emergency.

11 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

Section 1. Section 9-812, Revised Statutes Supplement,

- 2 2007, is amended to read:
- 3 9-812 (1) All money received from the operation of
- 4 lottery games conducted pursuant to the State Lottery Act in
- 5 Nebraska shall be credited to the State Lottery Operation Trust
- 6 Fund, which fund is hereby created. All payments of the costs
- 7 of establishing and maintaining the lottery games shall be made
- 8 from the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund. In accordance with
- 9 legislative appropriations, money for payments for expenses of the
- 10 division shall be transferred from the State Lottery Operation
- 11 Trust Fund to the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund, which fund
- 12 is hereby created. All money necessary for the payment of lottery
- 13 prizes shall be transferred from the State Lottery Operation Trust
- 14 Fund to the State Lottery Prize Trust Fund, which fund is hereby
- 15 created. The amount used for the payment of lottery prizes shall
- 16 not be less than forty percent of the dollar amount of the lottery
- 17 tickets which have been sold.
- 18 (2) (a) Beginning October 1, 2003, and until July 1, <del>2009,</del>
- 19 2012, a portion of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which
- 20 have been sold on an annualized basis shall be transferred from
- 21 the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund to the Education Innovation
- 22 Fund, the Nebraska Scholarship Fund, the Nebraska Environmental
- 23 Trust Fund, the Nebraska State Fair Board, and the Compulsive
- 24 Gamblers Assistance Fund, except that the dollar amount transferred
- 25 shall not be less than the dollar amount transferred to the funds

- 1 in fiscal year 2002-03.
- 2 (b) On and after July 1, 2009, 2012, at least twenty-five
- 3 percent of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been
- 4 sold on an annualized basis shall be transferred from the State
- 5 Lottery Operation Trust Fund to the Education Innovation Fund,
- 6 the Nebraska Scholarship Fund, the Nebraska Environmental Trust
- 7 Fund, the Nebraska State Fair Board, and the Compulsive Gamblers
- 8 Assistance Fund.
- 9 (3) Of the money available to be transferred to the
- 10 Education Innovation Fund, the Nebraska Scholarship Fund, the
- 11 Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, the Nebraska State Fair Board,
- 12 and the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund:
- 13 (a) The first five hundred thousand dollars shall be
- 14 transferred to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used
- 15 as provided in section sections 71-816 and 71-817;
- 16 (b) Nineteen and three-fourths percent of the money
- 17 remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and
- 18 the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund
- 19 shall be transferred to the Education Innovation Fund;
- 20 (c) Twenty-four and three-fourths percent of the money
- 21 remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and
- 22 the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund
- 23 shall be transferred to the Nebraska Scholarship Fund;
- 24 (d) Forty-four and one-half percent of the money
- 25 remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and

1 the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund

- 2 shall be transferred to the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund to be
- 3 used as provided in the Nebraska Environmental Trust Act;
- 4 (e) Ten percent of the money remaining after the payment
- 5 of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to
- 6 the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to
- 7 the Nebraska State Fair Board if the most populous city within
- 8 the county in which the fair is located provides matching funds
- 9 equivalent to ten percent of the funds available for transfer. Such
- 10 matching funds may be obtained from the city and any other private
- 11 or public entity, except that no portion of such matching funds
- 12 shall be provided by the state. If the Nebraska State Fair ceases
- 13 operations, ten percent of the money remaining after the payment
- 14 of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the
- 15 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the
- 16 General Fund; and
- 17 (f) One percent of the money remaining after the payment
- 18 of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the
- 19 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the
- 20 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used as provided in
- 21 section sections 71-816 and 71-817.
- 22 (4)(a) The Education Innovation Fund is created. At least
- 23 seventy-five percent of the lottery proceeds allocated to the
- 24 Education Innovation Fund shall be available for disbursement.
- 25 (b) For fiscal year 2005-06, the Education Innovation

1 Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first one million dollars

- 2 shall be transferred to the School District Reorganization Fund,
- 3 and the remaining amount shall be allocated to the General Fund
- 4 after operating expenses for the Excellence in Education Council
- 5 are deducted.
- 6 (c) For fiscal year 2006-07, the Education Innovation
- 7 Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first two hundred fifty
- 8 thousand dollars shall be transferred to the Attracting Excellence
- 9 to Teaching Program Cash Fund to fund the Attracting Excellence
- 10 to Teaching Program Act, the next one million dollars shall
- 11 be transferred to the School District Reorganization Fund, and
- 12 the amount remaining in the Education Innovation Fund shall be
- 13 allocated, after administrative expenses, for distance education
- 14 equipment and incentives pursuant to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337.
- 15 (d) For fiscal year 2007-08, the Education Innovation
- 16 Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first five hundred thousand
- 17 dollars shall be transferred to the Attracting Excellence to
- 18 Teaching Program Cash Fund to fund the Attracting Excellence to
- 19 Teaching Program Act, and the amount remaining in the Education
- 20 Innovation Fund shall be allocated, after administrative expenses,
- 21 for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant to
- 22 sections 79-1336 and 79-1337.
- 23 (e) For fiscal year 2008-09, the Education Innovation
- 24 Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first seven hundred
- 25 fifty thousand dollars shall be transferred to the Attracting

1 Excellence to Teaching Program Cash Fund to fund the Attracting

- 2 Excellence to Teaching Program Act, and the amount remaining in the
- 3 Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated, after administrative
- 4 expenses, for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant
- 5 to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337.
- 6 (f) For fiscal years 2009-10 through 2015-16, the
- 7 Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated as follows: The
- 8 first one million dollars shall be transferred to the Attracting
- 9 Excellence to Teaching Program Cash Fund to fund the Attracting
- 10 Excellence to Teaching Program Act, and the amount remaining in the
- 11 Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated, after administrative
- 12 expenses, for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant
- 13 to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337.
- 14 (g) For fiscal year 2016-17 and each fiscal year
- 15 thereafter, the Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated,
- 16 after administrative expenses, for education purposes as provided
- 17 by the Legislature.
- 18 (5) Any money in the State Lottery Operation Trust
- 19 Fund, the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund, the State Lottery
- 20 Prize Trust Fund, or the Education Innovation Fund available
- 21 for investment shall be invested by the state investment officer
- 22 pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska
- 23 State Funds Investment Act.
- 24 (6) Unclaimed prize money on a winning lottery ticket
- 25 shall be retained for a period of time prescribed by rules and

1 regulations. If no claim is made within such period, the prize

- 2 money shall be used at the discretion of the Tax Commissioner for
- 3 any of the purposes prescribed in this section.
- 4 Sec. 2. Section 71-816, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 5 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 6 71-816 (1) The Legislature finds that the main sources
- 7 of funding for the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund are the
- 8 Charitable Gaming Operations Fund as provided in section 9-1,101
- 9 and the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund as provided in section
- 10 9-812 and Article III, section 24, of the Constitution of Nebraska.
- 11 It is the intent of the Legislature that the Compulsive Gamblers
- 12 Assistance Fund be used primarily for counseling and treatment
- 13 services for problem gamblers and their families who are residents
- 14 of Nebraska.
- 15 (1) (2) The State Advisory Committee on Problem Gambling
- 16 and Addiction Services is created. Members of the committee
- 17 shall have a demonstrated interest and commitment and specialized
- 18 knowledge, experience, or expertise relating to the provision of
- 19 problem gambling and addiction services in the State of Nebraska.
- 20 The committee shall consist of twelve members appointed by the
- 21 Governor and shall include at least three consumers of problem
- 22 gambling or addiction services.
- 23 (2) (3) The committee shall be responsible to the
- 24 division and shall (a) conduct regular meetings, (b) provide advice
- 25 and assistance to the division relating to the provision adopt a

plan for administration of problem gambling and addiction services 1 2 in the State of Nebraska and for disbursements from the Compulsive 3 Gamblers Assistance Fund and provide a copy of the plan to the division, (c) evaluate and approve applications for funding from 5 the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund, and make recommendations 6 relating to disbursements from the fund, (d) promote the interests 7 of consumers of such services and their families, (e) provide reports as requested by the division, within sixty days after the 9 end of each fiscal year, submit a report to the Legislature that 10 provides details about the plan, the provision of problem gambling and addiction services, and the distribution of the fund, including 11 12 the recommendations of the committee and explanations if such 13 recommendations were not followed, and (f) engage in such other 14 activities as directed or authorized by the division. necessary to 15 carry out its duties under this section. 16 Sec. 3. Section 71-817, Revised Statutes Cumulative 17 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read: 18 71-817 The Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund is created. The fund shall include revenue transferred from the 19 20 State Lottery Operation Trust Fund under section 9-812 and the 21 Charitable Gaming Operations Fund under section 9-1,101 and any 22 other revenue received by the division for credit to the fund from 23 any other public or private source, including, but not limited to, 24 appropriations, grants, donations, gifts, devises, bequests, fees, 25 or reimbursements. The division shall administer the fund for the

treatment of problem gamblers as recommended upon approval by the 1 2 State Advisory Committee on Problem Gambling and Addiction Services 3 established under section 71-816. The division and shall spend no more than ten percent of the money appropriated to the fund for 4 5 administrative costs. The Director of Administrative Services shall 6 draw warrants upon the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund upon the 7 presentation of proper vouchers by the division which indicate the 8 express approval of the committee for each expenditure. Money from 9 the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be used exclusively 10 for the purpose of providing assistance to agencies, groups, 11 organizations, and individuals that provide education, assistance, and counseling, assistance, and education to individuals and 12 13 families experiencing difficulty as a result of problem gambling, 14 to promote the awareness of gamblers assistance programs, and to 15 pay the costs and expenses of the division and the committee 16 with regard to problem gambling. The division shall not provide 17 any direct services to problem gamblers or their families. Funds 18 appropriated from the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall not 19 be granted or loaned to or administered by any regional behavioral 20 health authority unless the authority is a direct provider of 21 a problem gamblers assistance program. Any money in the fund 22 available for investment shall be invested by the state investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the 23 24 Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.
