1	FOR AN	ACT relating to infectious disease exposure; to amend
2		section 71-507, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement,
3		2006; to redefine terms; and to repeal the original section.
4	Be it en	acted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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Section 1. Section 71-507, Revised Statutes Cumulative
 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

3 71-507. For purposes of sections 71-507 to 71-513:
4 (1) Alternate facility means a facility other than a health
5 care facility that receives a patient transported to the facility by
6 an emergency services provider;

7 (2) Department means the Department of Health and Human
8 Services Regulation and Licensure;

9 (3) Designated physician means the physician representing the emergency services provider as identified by name, address, and 10 11 telephone number on the significant exposure report form. The designated physician shall serve as the contact for notification in 12 the event an emergency services provider believes he or she has had 13 14 significant exposure to an infectious disease or condition. Each 15 emergency services provider shall designate a physician as provided in 16 subsection (2) of section 71-509;

17 (4) Emergency services provider means an out-of-hospital 18 emergency care provider certified pursuant to the Emergency Medical 19 Services Act, a sheriff, a deputy sheriff, a police officer, a state 20 highway patrol Nebraska State Patrol officer, a funeral director, a 21 paid or volunteer firefighter, a school district employee, and a 22 person rendering emergency care gratuitously as described in section 23 25-21,186;

(5) Funeral director means a person licensed under section 71-1302 or an employee of such a person with responsibility for transport or handling of a deceased human;

(6) Funeral establishment means a business licensed under

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section 71-1327; (7) Health care facility has the meaning found in sections 71-419, 71-420, 71-424, and 71-429 or any facility that receives patients of emergencies who are transported to the facility by emergency services providers;

6 (8) Infectious disease or condition means hepatitis B, 7 hepatitis C, meningococcal meningitis, active pulmonary tuberculosis, 8 human immunodeficiency virus, diphtheria, plague, hemorrhagic fevers, 9 rabies, and such other diseases as the department may by rule and 10 regulation specify;

11 (9) Patient means an individual who is sick, injured, 12 wounded, deceased, or otherwise helpless or incapacitated; (10) Patient's attending physician means the physician 13 14 having the primary responsibility for the patient as indicated on the 15 records of a health care facility;

16 (11) Provider agency means any law enforcement agency, fire 17 department, emergency medical service, funeral establishment, or other 18 entity which employs or directs emergency services providers or public 19 safety officials;

20 (12) Public safety official means a sheriff, a deputy sheriff, a police officer, a state highway patrol Nebraska State 21 22 Patrol officer, an individual employed by the Department of Correctional Services, an individual employed by a city or county 23 correctional facility, jail, or juvenile detention facility, a paid 24 25 or volunteer firefighter, a school district employee, and any civilian law enforcement employee or volunteer performing his or her 26 27 duties, other than those as an emergency services provider;

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1 (13) Responsible person means an individual who has been 2 designated by an alternate facility to carry out the facility's 3 responsibilities under sections 71-507 to 71-513. A responsible person 4 may be designated on a case-by-case basis;

5 (14) Significant exposure means a situation in which the 6 body fluids, including blood, saliva, urine, respiratory secretions, 7 or feces, of a patient or individual have entered the body of an 8 emergency services provider or public safety official through a body opening including the mouth or nose, a mucous membrane, or a break in 9 skin from cuts or abrasions, from a contaminated needlestick or 10 11 scalpel, from intimate respiratory contact, or through any other situation when the patient's or individual's body fluids may have 12 entered the emergency services provider's or public safety official's 13 14 body or when an airborne pathogen may have been transmitted from the patient or individual to the emergency services provider or public 15 16 safety official; and

17 (15) Significant exposure report form means the form used by 18 the emergency services provider to document information necessary for 19 notification of significant exposure to an infectious disease or 20 condition.
