1 Section 1. Section 68-1070, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 3 68-1070 (1) If the following non-United-States citizens
- 4 meet the income and other requirements for participation in the
- 5 medical assistance program established pursuant to the Medical
- 6 Assistance Act, in the program for financial assistance pursuant
- 7 to section 43-512, in the food stamp program administered by the
- 8 State of Nebraska pursuant to the federal Food Stamp Act, or in
- 9 the program for assistance to the aged, blind, and disabled, such
- 10 persons shall be eligible for such program or benefits:
- 11 (a) Non-United-States citizens lawfully admitted,
- 12 regardless of the date entry was granted, into the United States
- 13 for permanent residence;
- 14 (b) (a) Refugees admitted under section 207 of the
- 15 federal Immigration and Naturalization Act, non-United-States
- 16 citizens granted asylum under section 208 of such federal act,
- 17 and non-United-States citizens whose deportation is withheld under
- 18 section 243(h) of such federal act, regardless of the date of entry
- 19 into the United States; and
- 20 (e) (b) Individuals for whom coverage is mandated under
- 21 federal law.
- 22 (2) Individuals eligible for food stamp assistance under
- 23 this section shall receive any food stamp coupons or electronic
- 24 benefits or a state voucher which can be used only for food
- 25 products authorized under the federal Food Stamp Act, in the amount

of the food stamp benefit for which this individual was otherwise

- 2 eligible but for the citizenship provisions of Public Law 104-193,
- 3 110 Stat. 2105 (1996).
- 4 (3) (2) The income and resources of any individual who
- 5 assists a non-United-States citizen to enter the United States
- 6 by signing an affidavit of support shall be deemed available
- 7 in determining the non-United-States citizen's eligibility for
- 8 assistance until the non-United-States citizen becomes a United
- 9 States citizen.
- 10 Sec. 2. This act becomes operative on July 1, 2007.
- 11 Sec. 3. Original section 68-1070, Revised Statutes
- 12 Cumulative Supplement, 2006, is repealed.
- Sec. 4. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
- 14 when passed and approved according to law.
