Section 1. Section 43-1314, Revised Statutes Cumulative
Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:

3 43-1314 Except as otherwise provided in the Nebraska Indian Child Welfare Act, notice of the court review and the right 4 5 of participation in all court reviews pertaining to a child in a foster care placement shall be provided by the court having 6 7 jurisdiction over such child for the purposes of foster care 8 placement either in court, by mail, or in such other manner as 9 the court may direct. Such notice shall be provided to all of the 10 following that are applicable to the case: (1) The person charged 11 with the care of such child; (2) the child's parents or guardian 12 unless the parental rights of the parents have been terminated 13 by court action as provided in section 43-292 or 43-297; (3) the 14 foster child if age fourteen or over; (4) the foster parent or 15 parents of the foster child; (5) the guardian ad litem of the 16 foster child; (6) the state board; (7) the preadoptive parent; and 17 (8) the relative providing care for the child. Notice to the foster 18 parent, preadoptive parent, or relative providing care shall not be construed to require that such foster parent, preadoptive parent, 19 20 or relative is a necessary party to the review. The If the foster 21 parent, preadoptive parent, or relative providing care for the child is present at the court review, the court may shall inquire 22 23 into the well-being of the foster child by asking questions of the 24 foster parent, preadoptive parent, or relative providing care for 25 the child. any such parent or relative.
