- 8 medical assistance for intensive early intervention services based
- 9 on behavioral principles for children with a medical diagnosis
- 10 of an autism spectrum disorder or an educational verification of

- (2) It is the intent of the Legislature that such waiver 13 or amendment (a) require means testing for and cost-sharing by
- 15 whom such services have been initiated prior to the age of nine

recipient families; (b) limit eligibility only to children for

- 16 years; (c) be implemented incrementally over time; (d) require
- 17 demonstrated progress toward the attainment of treatment goals as a
- 18 condition for continued receipt of medical assistance benefits for
- 19 such treatment; (e) be developed in consultation with the Health
- 20 and Human Services Committee of the Legislature and the federal
- 21 Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services and with the input of
- 22 parents and families of children with autism spectrum disorders
- and organizations advocating on behalf of such persons; and (f) be 23
- 24 submitted to the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services
- 25 as soon as reasonably possible, but no later than July 1, 2008.
