A BILL

- 1 FOR AN ACT relating to school technology and telecommunications;
 2 to amend sections 79-1332, 79-1336, and 79-1337, Revised
 3 Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2006; to define a
 4 term; to add provisions relating to distance education
 5 classrooms; to provide for per hour incentives; to
 6 harmonize provisions; and to repeal the original
 7 sections.
- 8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 79-1332, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 3 79-1332 For purposes of sections 79-1331 to 79-1337:
- 4 (1) Distance education course means a course with at
- 5 least one student in any of grades kindergarten through twelve
- 6 who is in a different location than the teacher and taught by a
- 7 teacher employed by an educational entity either utilizing two-way
- 8 interactive video or the Internet without two-way interactive
- 9 video. Distance education course includes a dual-enrollment course
- 10 with at least one student who is in a different location than the
- 11 teacher and taught by a teacher employed by an educational entity
- 12 utilizing either two-way interactive video or the Internet without
- 13 two-way interactive video;
- 14 (2) Dual-enrollment course means a course taught to
- 15 students for credit at both a high school and a postsecondary
- 16 educational institution;
- 17 (3) Educational entity means a school district, a
- 18 private, denominational, or parochial school, an educational
- 19 service unit, a community college, a state college, the University
- 20 of Nebraska, or a nonprofit private postsecondary educational
- 21 institution;
- 22 (4) Elementary distance education course means a distance
- 23 education course which is delivered utilizing two-way interactive
- 24 video to students who are enrolled in any of grades kindergarten
- 25 through eight;

1 (4) (5) Network Nebraska means the network created

- 2 pursuant to section 86-5,100;
- 3 (5) (6) Qualified distance education course means a
- 4 distance education course which meets any applicable rules and
- 5 regulations of the State Department of Education, is offered for
- 6 one semester of high school credit or the equivalent, and for which
- 7 all of the participating educational entities are required to have
- 8 access to Network Nebraska; and
- 9 (6) (7) Two-way interactive video distance education
- 10 course means a distance education course in which a teacher
- 11 delivers instruction to students in a different location than the
- 12 teacher using two-way interactive video on at least two different
- 13 days per week during the course.
- 14 Sec. 2. Section 79-1336, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 15 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 16 79-1336 (1) For fiscal years 2007-08 through 2013-14,
- 17 the State Department of Education shall provide distance education
- 18 equipment reimbursement to school districts and educational service
- 19 units from the Education Innovation Fund as provided in this
- 20 section. Such reimbursements shall be for hardware or software
- 21 purchased after July 14, 2006, for use in distance education
- 22 and shall be limited to a total through fiscal year 2013-14 of
- 23 twenty thousand dollars multiplied by the number of high school
- 24 buildings for each school district and twenty thousand dollars
- 25 for each educational service unit office with a distance education

1 classroom, except that no educational service unit shall count

- 2 more than one office with a distance education classroom for each
- 3 four thousand square miles within the boundaries of the educational
- 4 service unit. If a school district has one or more former high
- 5 school buildings that are no longer being used as high school
- 6 buildings due to a school district merger and such buildings have
- 7 distance education classrooms at the time of application, such
- 8 buildings shall be deemed high school buildings for the purposes
- 9 of this subsection. The reimbursements may include installation
- 10 costs for such hardware or software. Applications shall be accepted
- 11 by the department beginning in the first year that the school
- 12 district or the educational service unit accesses Network Nebraska
- 13 and ending June 30, 2013. Applications shall be submitted on or
- 14 before July 1 of each year on a form specified by the department
- 15 and shall include:
- 16 (a) A description of the hardware or software purchased
- 17 and how the hardware or software will be used for distance
- 18 education;
- 19 (b) Copies of receipts for the purchases to be
- 20 reimbursed; and
- 21 (c) For school districts, a commitment to either send
- 22 or receive two-way interactive video distance education courses
- 23 through the Distance Education Council each semester, or the
- 24 equivalent of two semester courses each year, for four years and to
- 25 apply for distance education incentives pursuant to section 79-1337

1 or to provide any other evidence required by the department to show

- 2 that the commitment was met.
- 3 (2) On or before August 1 of each year, the department
- 4 shall certify the reimbursements to be paid to each school district
- 5 or educational service unit on or before September 1 of each year.
- 6 (3) The department shall use the applications for
- 7 distance education incentives submitted pursuant to section 79-1337
- 8 and any other information requested by the department pursuant to
- 9 rules and regulations of the department to verify that each school
- 10 district that received a reimbursement completes the commitment to
- 11 either send or receive two-way interactive video distance education
- 12 courses through the Distance Education Council for four years. Any
- 13 school district failing to complete such commitment shall repay
- 14 the Education Innovation Fund for the amount of any reimbursements
- 15 received pursuant to this section. On or before September 1 of each
- 16 year, the department shall notify any school district failing to
- 17 complete the commitment for the prior school year that repayment
- 18 of the reimbursement is required and the amount of such repayment.
- 19 Repayments shall be due on or before the immediately following
- 20 December 31. Late repayments shall accrue interest at the rate
- 21 prescribed in section 45-104.02 from the date of the initial
- 22 reimbursement.
- 23 (4) On or before October 1 of each year, a school
- 24 district or educational service unit may appeal the denial of
- 25 reimbursements or a school district may appeal the requirement to

1 repay reimbursements to the State Board of Education. The board

- 2 shall allow a representative of the school district or educational
- 3 service unit an opportunity to present information concerning the
- 4 appeal to the board at the November board meeting. If the board
- 5 finds that the department denied the reimbursement in error, the
- 6 department shall pay the district or educational service unit from
- 7 the Education Innovation Fund as soon as practical the amount which
- 8 was denied in error. If the board finds that the department erred
- 9 in notifying a school district that a reimbursement is required to
- 10 be repaid, such notification shall be void.
- 11 (5) The State Board of Education shall adopt and
- 12 promulgate rules and regulations to carry out this section.
- Sec. 3. Section 79-1337, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 14 Supplement, 2006, is amended to read:
- 15 79-1337 (1) For fiscal years 2007-08 through 2015-16,
- 16 the State Department of Education shall provide distance education
- 17 incentives from the Education Innovation Fund to school districts
- 18 and educational service units for qualified distance education
- 19 courses and coordinated through the Distance Education Council as
- 20 provided in this section.
- 21 (2) School districts and educational service units shall
- 22 apply for incentives annually to the department on or before August
- 23 1 on a form specified by the department. The application shall:
- 24 (a) For school districts, specify (i) the qualified
- 25 distance education courses which were received by students in the

1 membership of the district in the then-current school fiscal year

- 2 and which were not taught by a teacher employed by the school
- 3 district and (ii) for each such course (A) the number of students
- 4 in the membership of the district who received the course, (B)
- 5 the educational entity employing the teacher, and (C) whether the
- 6 course was a two-way interactive video distance education course;
- 7 and
- 8 (b) For school districts and educational service units,
- 9 specify (i) the qualified distance education courses which were
- 10 received by students in the membership of another educational
- 11 entity in the then-current school fiscal year and which were
- 12 taught by a teacher employed by the school district or educational
- 13 service unit, (ii) for each such course for school districts,
- 14 the number of students in the membership of the district who
- 15 received the course, and (iii) for each such course (A) the other
- 16 educational entities in which students received the course and how
- 17 many students received the course at such educational entities,
- 18 (B) any school districts in the sparse cost grouping or the very
- 19 sparse cost grouping as described in section 79-1007.02 that had
- 20 at least one student in the membership who received the course,
- 21 and (C) whether the course was a two-way interactive video distance
- 22 education course.
- 23 (3) On or before September 1 of each year, the department
- 24 shall certify the incentives to be paid to each school district and
- 25 educational service unit on or before October 1 of each year. The

- 1 incentives for each district shall be calculated as follows:
- 2 (a) Each district shall receive distance education units
- 3 for each qualified distance education course as follows:
- 4 (i) One distance education unit for each qualified
- 5 distance education course received as reported pursuant to
- 6 subdivision (2)(a) of this section if the course was a two-way
- 7 interactive video distance education course;
- 8 (ii) One distance education unit for each qualified
- 9 distance education course sent as reported pursuant to subdivision
- 10 (2) (b) of this section if the course was not received by at least
- 11 one student who was in the membership of another school district
- 12 which was in the sparse cost grouping or the very sparse cost
- 13 grouping;
- 14 (iii) One distance education unit for each qualified
- 15 distance education course sent as reported pursuant to subdivision
- 16 (2)(b) of this section if the course was received by at least
- 17 one student who was in the membership of another school district
- 18 which was in the sparse cost grouping or the very sparse cost
- 19 grouping, but the course was not a two-way interactive video
- 20 distance education course; and
- 21 (iv) Two distance education units for each qualified
- 22 distance education course sent as reported pursuant to subdivision
- 23 (2) (b) of this section if the course was received by at least one
- 24 student who was in the membership of another school district which
- 25 was in the sparse cost grouping or the very sparse cost grouping

1 and the course was a two-way interactive video distance education

- 2 course;
- 3 (b) The difference of the amount available for
- 4 distribution in the Education Innovation Fund on the August 1 when
- 5 the applications were due minus any amount to be paid to school
- 6 districts pursuant to section 79-1336 shall be divided by the
- 7 number of distance education units to determine the incentive per
- 8 distance education unit, except that the incentive per distance
- 9 education unit shall not equal an amount greater than one thousand
- 10 dollars; and
- 11 (c) The incentives for each school district shall equal
- 12 the number of distance education units calculated for the school
- 13 district multiplied by the incentive per distance education unit.
- 14 (4) If there are additional funds available for
- 15 distribution after equipment reimbursements pursuant to section
- 16 79-1336 and incentives calculated pursuant to subsections (1) to
- 17 (3) of this section, school districts and educational service
- 18 units may qualify for additional incentives for elementary distance
- 19 education courses. Such incentives shall be calculated for sending
- 20 and receiving school districts and educational service units as
- 21 follows:
- 22 (a) The per hour incentives shall equal the funds
- 23 available for distribution after equipment reimbursements pursuant
- 24 to section 79-1336 and incentives calculated pursuant to
- 25 subsections (1) through (3) of this section divided by the sum of

1 the hours of elementary distance education course sent or received

- 2 for each school district and educational service unit submitting
- 3 an application, except that the per hour incentives shall not be
- 4 greater than ten dollars;
- 5 (b) The elementary distance education incentives for each
- 6 school district and educational service unit shall equal the per
- 7 hour incentive multiplied by the hours of elementary distance
- 8 education course sent or received by the school district or
- 9 <u>educational service unit.</u>
- 10 (4) (5) The department may verify any or all application
- 11 information using annual curriculum reports and may request such
- 12 verification from the Distance Education Council.
- 13 (6) On or before October 1 of each year, a school
- 14 district or educational service unit may appeal the denial of
- 15 incentives for any course by the department to the State Board of
- 16 Education. The board shall allow a representative of the school
- 17 district or educational service unit an opportunity to present
- 18 information concerning the appeal to the board at the November
- 19 board meeting. If the board finds that the course meets the
- 20 requirements of this section, the department shall pay the district
- 21 from the Education Innovation Fund as soon as practical in an
- 22 amount for which the district or educational service unit should
- 23 have qualified based on the incentive per distance education unit
- 24 used in the original certification of incentives pursuant to this
- 25 section.

1 (6) (7) The State Board of Education shall adopt and

- 2 promulgate rules and regulations to carry out this section.

- 4 Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2006, are repealed.
