1	FOR AN	ACT relating to railroad crossings; to prohibit the
2		obstruction of highways in certain classes of cities
3		and villages and other areas; to provide penalties; to
4		provide exemptions; to provide an affirmative defense
5		to define terms; and to outright repeal section 17-225
6		Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska.
7	Be it er	nacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1 Section 1. (1) No person shall occupy or block any public

- 2 highway, street, or alley in any city of the first class, city
- 3 of the second class or village, or any unincorporated area of the
- 4 state with freight or passenger cars, locomotives, or with any
- 5 other rolling stock for more than ten minutes at a time.
- 6 (2) A state or local law enforcement officer may issue
- 7 citations for violations of subsection (1) of this section. Any
- 8 person violating subsection (1) of this section, upon conviction
- 9 thereof, also shall be fined a sum not less than five hundred
- 10 dollars nor more than five thousand dollars.
- 11 (3) This section shall not apply to:
- 12 (a) Any member of a train crew, yard crew, or locomotive
- 13 crew upon reasonable proof that the occupying or blocking of the
- 14 public highway, street, or alley was necessary to comply with
- 15 orders or instructions, either written or oral, from his or her
- 16 employer or its officers or supervisory officials;
- 17 (b) A grain dealer licensed under the Grain Dealer Act;
- 18 and
- (c) A warehouse licensee under the Grain Warehouse Act.
- 20 (4) This section does not relieve an employer from
- 21 any responsibility placed upon the employer by any other law
- 22 or ordinance. This section is supplemental to any other law or
- 23 ordinance.
- 24 (5) A person may have an affirmative defense to a
- 25 violation of subsection (1) of this section if the public highway,

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1 street, or alley was occupied or blocked due to an emergency

- 2 condition, including a serious rail accident, derailment, or a
- 3 critical mechanical failure, a track or bridge washout, or a storm,
- 4 flood, or other emergency.
- 5 (6) For purposes of this section:
- 6 (a) Occupy or block means to prevent motor vehicular
- 7 traffic from safely crossing over the grade crossing and continuing
- 8 on the public highway, street, or alley.
- 9 (b) Person means any individual, partnership, firm,
- 10 limited liability company, corporation, company, association, or
- 11 any other legal entity.
- 12 Sec. 2. Any railroad cited for any violation of section 1
- 13 of this act may only address the citation with the respective crew
- 14 members as follows:
- 15 (1) Such railroad shall accord any crew members a due
- 16 process hearing that the railroad deems may have violated written
- 17 railroad rules or published policy, prior to the issuance of any
- 18 decision adversely affecting the employment of such employees;
- 19 (2) Such railroad, prior to the due process hearing,
- 20 shall provide any accused crew members with copies of all
- 21 documentation the employees request that are relevant to receipt of
- 22 the citation;
- 23 (3) Such railroad, prior to the due process hearing,
- 24 shall provide any accused crew members with the required witnesses
- 25 at the expense of the railroad;

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1 (4) Such railroad shall accord the accused crew members

- 2 the due process hearing within twenty days after receipt of the
- 3 citation; and
- 4 (5) Such railroad shall notify the accused members in
- 5 writing of the requirements set forth in this section.
