- THE MEMBERS OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH LEGISLATURE OF NEBRASKA,
- 2 FIRST SESSION, RESOLVE THAT:
- Section 1. At the general election in November 2008 the following proposed amendment to the Constitution of Nebraska shall be submitted to the electors of the State of Nebraska for approval or

- 7 To amend Article XI, section 1:
- 8 XI-1. No city, county, town, precinct, municipality, or
 9 other sub-division subdivision of the state, shall ever become a
 10 subscriber to the capital stock, or owner of such stock, or any
 11 portion or interest therein of any railroad, or private corporation,
 12 or association, except that, notwithstanding any other provision of
 13 this Constitution, the Legislature may authorize the investment of the
 14 public endowment funds of cities, villages, school districts, public
 15 power districts, and other political subdivisions in the manner
 - required of a prudent investor who shall act with care, skill, and
- 17 <u>diligence under the prevailing circumstance and in such investments</u>

1	as the governing body of such city, village, school district, public
2	power district, and other political subdivision, acting in a
3	fiduciary capacity for the exclusive purpose of protecting and
4	benefiting such investment, may determine, subject to such
5	limitations as the Legislature may by statute provide.
6	Sec. 2. The proposed amendment shall be submitted to the
7	electors in the manner prescribed by the Constitution of Nebraska,
8	Article XVI, section 1, with the following ballot language:
9	A constitutional amendment to authorize the investment of
10	the public endowment funds of cities, villages, school
11	districts, public power districts, and other political
12	subdivisions in such manner and in such investments as the
13	governing body of such political subdivision may determine,
14	subject to limitations by the Legislature.
