Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 28 authorizes undercover license plates and driver's licenses for federal law enforcement agencies.

The bill amends Sec.60-3,135 to include federal law enforcement agencies as eligible for undercover license plates. The plates must be used for legitimate criminal investigatory purposes.

The bill also amends Sec. 60-480.01 to include federal law enforcement agencies as eligible for undercover drivers' licenses. The license must be used for legitimate criminal investigatory purposes.
