Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LB 543 creates a new definition of specialty vehicle under the Motor Vehicle Industry Licensing terms, and exempts a manufacturer or dealer from the licensing requirement when selling such vehicle directly to a city of the primary or metropolitan class.

The bill adds a definition of specialty vehicle to mean one which has a gross vehicle weight greater than 8,500 pounds and is generally sold to a political subdivision in the performance of its governmental functions. Specialty vehicles include a fire truck, ladder truck, fire pump truck, street sweeper, ambulance, hazardous materials vehicle, and mobile command vehicle.

The bill amends § 60-1403.01 to exempt a manufacturer, factory representative, distributor, dealer, or salesperson from
