## Summary of purpose and/or changes:

LR11 calls for the Executive Board to reappoint the Developmental Disabilities Special Investigative Committee. The Special Committee was first created by LR 283 in 2008. LR11 provides that the committee shall consist of the same seven members originally appointed pursuant to LR 283: Senators Adams, Cornett, Gay, Harms, Lathrop, Stuthman and Wallman. The resolution further designates Senator Lathrop as the chairperson and Senator Harms as the vice-chairperson.

The resolution authorizes the committee to continue its study of the quality of care and related staffing issues at the Beatrice State Developmental Center, and the placement and quality of care statewide for the developmentally disabled in Nebraska (to include funding, capacity, options and staffing practices). The committee shall also provide oversight to ensure that the terms of the U.S. Department of Justice Consent Decree and the recommendations from the committee%u2019s own report, dated December 15, 2008, are implemented in a timely fashion. The committee shall

issue a report as circumstances warrant.

Explanation of amendments:

The committee amendment (AM281) does the following:

Adds a new "Resolved" paragraph authorizing the Developmental Disabilities Special Investigative Committee to continue its work until the beginning of the One Hundred Second Legislature, First Session.

Harmonizes the reference to the Developmental Disabilities Special Investigative Committee in the third "Resolved" paragraph so that it is consistent with the other resolved paragraphs.
