A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT relating to the Nebraska State Fair; to amend sections
2	2-109, 2-110, 2-111, and 2-1208.01, Reissue Revised
3	Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 2-101 and 2-113,
4	Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2008; to change
5	and eliminate provisions relating to relocation, matching
6	funds, reports, studies, and taxes on horseracing; to
7	provide operative dates; to repeal the original sections;
8	to outright repeal section 2-131, Reissue Revised
9	Statutes of Nebraska; and to declare an emergency.
10	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 2-101, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:
- 3 2-101 (1) The Nebraska State Fair Board, formerly known
- 4 as the State Board of Agriculture, shall hold an annual meeting for
- 5 the purpose of deliberating and consulting as to the wants,
- 6 prospects, and conditions of the agricultural, horticultural,
- 7 industrial, mechanical, and other interests throughout the state,
- 8 as well as those interests in the encouragement and perpetuation of
- 9 the arts, skilled crafts, and sciences.
- 10 (2) The Nebraska State Fair Board may provide in its
- 11 constitution and bylaws for the qualification and participation
- 12 of delegates at the annual meeting from such associations
- 13 incorporated under the laws of the state for purposes of promoting
- 14 and furthering the interests of participants in agricultural,
- 15 horticultural, industrial, mechanical, or other pursuits or for the
- 16 encouragement and perpetuation of the arts, skilled crafts, and
- 17 sciences, and from such associations as provide for the training,
- 18 encouragement, and competition of the youth of Nebraska in such
- 19 endeavors. The annual meeting shall be held in every odd-numbered
- 20 year at the capital of the state and in every even-numbered year at
- 21 such location as the board determines. The chairperson of the board
- 22 shall also have the power to call meetings of the board whenever he
- 23 or she may deem it expedient. All meetings of the board shall be
- 24 conducted in accordance with the Open Meetings Act.
- 25 (3) The Nebraska State Fair shall be under the direction

1 and supervision of the Nebraska State Fair Board. The board may, at

- 2 its discretion, hold or dispense with the holding of the fair, in
- 3 any year.
- 4 (4)(a) It is the intent of the Legislature that no later
- 5 than 2010 the Nebraska State Fair be permanently located within
- 6 the city of Grand Island upon the site and tract of land owned
- 7 by the Hall County Livestock Improvement Association and known as
- 8 Fonner Park no later than 2010. and, as available and necessary,
- 9 upon other parcels of land adjacent to Fonner Park. The Nebraska
- 10 State Fair Board shall cooperate and coordinate with the Hall
- 11 County Livestock Improvement Association, the city of Grand Island,
- 12 and other appropriate entities to provide for and carry out any
- 13 plan of improvements to Fonner Park, such location, including
- 14 the construction of buildings, and other capital facilities,
- 15 the relocation of existing improvements, and other enhancements,
- 16 necessary to develop the site as a location suitable for conducting
- 17 the Nebraska State Fair. Such cooperation and coordination may
- 18 include financial participation in the costs of site development,
- 19 new construction, and other capital improvements upon Fonner Park
- 20 such location and includes the execution of any agreement for site
- 21 governance, revenue sharing, and facility utilization between and
- 22 among the Nebraska State Fair Board, the Hall County Livestock
- 23 Improvement Association, and other appropriate entities.
- 24 (b) The Nebraska State Fair Board, the Department of
- 25 Administrative Services, and the Board of Regents of the University

1 of Nebraska shall cooperate with each other and with other

- 2 appropriate entities to provide for and carry out the plan to
- 3 relocate the Nebraska State Fair and transfer the Nebraska State
- 4 Fairgrounds in Lancaster County to the Board of Regents, including
- 5 activities by the Board of Regents to obtain due diligence surveys,
- 6 reports, and site assessments at the Nebraska State Fairgrounds in
- 7 Lancaster County and by the Nebraska State Fair Board in connection
- 8 with providing marketable title to the same in a form acceptable to
- 9 the Board of Regents.
- 10 Sec. 2. Section 2-109, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 11 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 12 2-109 The Department of Revenue shall, on a quarterly
- 13 basis, at the conclusion of each calendar quarter, provide to
- 14 the most populous city within the county in which the state
- 15 fair Nebraska State Fair is located, held written notification of
- 16 the amount estimated by the department to equal ten percent of
- 17 the lottery revenue collected during the calendar quarter to be
- 18 transferred to the Nebraska State Fair Support and Improvement Cash
- 19 Fund. If the state fair is scheduled to be held in a different
- 20 county from that in which the most recent state fair was held, the
- 21 written notification required by this section shall be made to the
- 22 most populous city within the county in which the state fair is
- 23 scheduled to be held beginning with the written notification made
- 24 at the conclusion of the first calendar quarter during the calendar
- 25 year in which the state fair is held or scheduled to be held in

1 <u>such county.</u> The department shall provide a copy of the written

- 2 notification to the Department of Administrative Services.
- 3 Sec. 3. Section 2-110, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 4 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 5 2-110 The most populous city within the county in
- 6 which the state fair is located Nebraska State Fair is held
- 7 or scheduled to be held that calendar year shall remit quarterly
- 8 payments to the State Treasurer in amounts equal to the matching
- 9 fund requirement established by the Department of Revenue under
- 10 section 2-109. The State Treasurer shall credit the matching funds
- 11 to the Nebraska State Fair Support and Improvement Cash Fund.
- 12 The city shall provide written notification to the Department
- 13 of Administrative Services regarding its compliance with the
- 14 matching fund requirement. Upon verification by the Department
- 15 of Administrative Services that a quarterly transfer of lottery
- 16 proceeds to the Nebraska State Fair Support and Improvement Cash
- 17 Fund has been executed and that the full amount of the matching
- 18 funds requirement has been received from the city, the Department
- 19 of Administrative Services shall authorize the expenditure of the
- 20 fund by the Nebraska State Fair Board. Matching fund requirements
- 21 shall not apply to investment income accruing to the fund and
- 22 investment income may be expended by the board.
- 23 Sec. 4. Section 2-111, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 24 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 25 2-111 (1) The Nebraska State Fair Board shall, no later

1 than November 1 of each year, provide an annual report to the

- 2 Governor and the Legislature regarding the use of the Nebraska
- 3 State Fair Support and Improvement Cash Fund. The report shall
- 4 include (a) (1) a detailed listing of how the proceeds of the
- 5 fund were expended in the prior fiscal year and (b) (2) any
- 6 distributions from the fund that remain unexpended and on deposit
- 7 in Nebraska State Fair accounts.
- 8 (2) The Nebraska State Fair Board shall cooperate with a
- 9 study by the Agriculture Committee of the Legislature of capital
- 10 facilities and infrastructure requirements to serve the purposes
- 11 and goals of the Nebraska State Fair and other uses of the Nebraska
- 12 State Fairgrounds as a year-round multipurpose facility sufficient
- 13 to host and accommodate events and attractions of local, state, and
- 14 regional interest and attendance. The Nebraska State Fair Board may
- 15 utilize available funds, not to exceed one hundred fifty thousand
- 16 dollars, including funds disbursed from the Nebraska State Fair
- 17 Support and Improvement Cash Fund and other resources, to assist in
- 18 completion of such study. This subsection terminates on January 1,
- 19 2008.
- 20 Sec. 5. Section 2-113, Revised Statutes Cumulative
- 21 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:
- 22 2-113 (1) Upon completion of the conditions specified
- 23 in subsection (2) of this section, the Director of Administrative
- 24 Services shall, on or before December 31, 2009, transfer by
- 25 warranty deed the site and tract of land in Lancaster County known

1 as the Nebraska State Fairgrounds, to the Board of Regents of the

- 2 University of Nebraska. Such transfer shall occur notwithstanding
- 3 sections 72-811 to 72-818 or any other provision of law.
- 4 (2) The transfer described in subsection (1) of this
- 5 section shall be contingent upon:
- 6 (a) Funds for the purpose of carrying out subsection
- 7 (4) of section 2-101 having been provided by or on behalf of the
- 8 University of Nebraska in a total amount of no less than twenty-one
- 9 million five hundred thousand dollars in cash or legally binding
- 10 commitments. Such funds may be provided over time, but they shall
- 11 in cumulative increments equal at least seven million five hundred
- 12 thousand dollars by October 1, 2008, fourteen million five hundred
- 13 thousand dollars by February 1, 2009, and twenty-one million five
- 14 hundred thousand dollars by July 1, 2009;
- 15 (b) The University of Nebraska providing a master plan
- 16 and business plan to carry out the master plan for the Innovation
- 17 Campus to the Department of Administrative Services and to the
- 18 Clerk of the Legislature on or before December 1, 2009, and
- 19 a commitment to provide on or before December 1 of each year
- 20 thereafter an annual update of the master plan and business plan to
- 21 the Clerk of the Legislature; and
- 22 (c) Funds for the purpose of carrying out subsection
- 23 (4) of section 2-101 having been provided by or on behalf of the
- 24 city of Grand Island in a total amount of no less than eight
- 25 million five hundred thousand dollars in cash or legally binding

1 commitments. Up to one million five hundred thousand dollars in

- 2 cash or legally binding commitments provided by or on behalf
- 3 of the city of Grand Island for the purpose of relocating and
- 4 reconstructing recreational facilities displaced by the relocation
- 5 of the Nebraska State Fair to Grand Island may be considered
- 6 part of the eight-million-five-hundred-thousand-dollar contribution
- 7 required by this subdivision. Such funds may be provided over
- 8 time, but they shall in cumulative increments equal at least three
- 9 million dollars by October 1, 2008, six million dollars by February
- 10 1, 2009, and eight million five hundred thousand dollars by July 1,
- 11 2009.
- 12 (3) The University of Nebraska and the city of
- 13 Grand Island shall provide certification to the Department of
- 14 Administrative Services on October 1, 2008, February 1, 2009, and
- 15 July 1, 2009, of all funds provided to carry out subsection (4) of
- 16 section 2-101. All amounts as certified in subdivisions (2)(a) and
- 17 (c) of this section shall be held and expended as determined by
- 18 agreement between the Hall County Livestock Improvement Association
- 19 and the Nebraska State Fair Board.
- 20 (4)(a) The Nebraska State Fair shall be relocated to
- 21 the city of Grand Island pursuant to subsection (4) of section
- 22 2-101 contingent upon completion of the conditions specified in
- 23 subsection (2) subdivisions (2) (a) and (c) of this section.
- 24 (b) The Nebraska State Fair Board shall be responsible
- 25 for any remaining costs associated with site improvements for

1 relocating the Nebraska State Fair, not to exceed seven million

- 2 dollars.
- 3 (c) On or before December 31, 2009, the Nebraska
- 4 State Fair Board shall provide written release or other written
- 5 instrument acceptable to the State Building Administrator in
- 6 consultation with the President of the University of Nebraska
- 7 in connection with the transfer of the Nebraska State Fairgrounds
- 8 to the Board of Regents.
- 9 Sec. 6. Section 2-1208.01, Reissue Revised Statutes of
- 10 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 11 2-1208.01 (1) There is hereby imposed a tax on the gross
- 12 sum wagered by the parimutuel method at each race enclosure during
- 13 a calendar year as follows:
- 14 (1) For meets conducted on the Nebraska State
- 15 Fairgrounds, no tax shall be imposed, but the licensee shall apply
- 16 two percent of any amount in excess of ten million dollars for the
- 17 purpose of maintenance of buildings, streets, utilities, and other
- 18 existing improvements on the Nebraska State Fairgrounds; and
- 19 (2) For all other meets:
- 20 (a) The first ten million dollars shall not be taxed;
- 21 (b) Any amount over ten million dollars but less than or
- 22 equal to seventy-three million dollars shall be taxed at the rate
- 23 of two and one-half percent; and
- 24 (c) Any amount in excess of seventy-three million dollars
- 25 shall be taxed at the rate of four percent. + and

1 (d) An (2) (a) Except as provided in subdivision (2) (b) of

- 2 this section, an amount equal to two percent of the first taxable
- 3 seventy million dollars at each race meeting shall be retained by
- 4 the licensee for capital improvements and for maintenance of the
- 5 premises within the licensed racetrack enclosure and shall be a
- 6 credit against the tax levied in subsection (1) of this section.
- 7 This subdivision includes each race meeting held after January 1,
- 8 2010, within the licensed racetrack enclosure located in Lancaster
- 9 County where the Nebraska State Fair was held prior to 2010.
- 10 (b) For race meetings conducted at the location where
- 11 the Nebraska State Fair is held, an amount equal to two and
- 12 one-half percent of the first taxable seventy million dollars at
- 13 each race meeting shall be retained by the licensee for the purpose
- 14 of maintenance of the premises within the licensed racetrack
- 15 enclosure and maintenance of other buildings, streets, utilities,
- 16 and existing improvements at the location where the Nebraska State
- 17 Fair is held. Such amount shall be a credit against the tax levied
- 18 in subsection (1) of this section.
- 19 (3) A return as required by the Tax Commissioner shall be
- 20 filed for a racetrack enclosure for each month during which wagers
- 21 are accepted at the enclosure. The return shall be filed with and
- 22 the net tax due pursuant to this section shall be paid to the
- 23 Department of Revenue on the tenth day of the following month.
- 24 Sec. 7. Sections 6 and 9 of this act become operative on
- 25 January 1, 2010. The other sections of this act become operative on

- 1 their effective date.
- 2 Sec. 8. Original sections 2-109, 2-110, and 2-111,
- 3 Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and sections 2-101 and
- 4 2-113, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2008, are repealed.
- 5 Sec. 9. Original section 2-1208.01, Reissue Revised
- 6 Statutes of Nebraska, is repealed.
- 7 Sec. 10. The following section is outright repealed:
- 8 Section 2-131, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska.
- 9 Sec. 11. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
- 10 when passed and approved according to law.
