A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT relating to appropriations; to state intent; to
2	define terms; to make appropriations for the expenses
3	of Nebraska State Government for the biennium ending
4	June 30, 2011; to transfer funds; to provide duties; to
5	provide an operative date; and to declare an emergency.
6	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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Section 1. DEFINITION OF APPROPRIATION PERIOD. For purposes of this act and any other legislative bill passed by the One Hundred First Legislature, First or Second Session, which appropriates funds, FY2008-09 means the period July 1, 2008, through July 1, 2009; FY2009-10 means the period July 1, 2009, through June 30, 2010; FY2010-11 means the period July 1, 2010, through June 30, 2011; FY2011-12 means the period July 1, 2011, through June 30, 2012; and FY2012-13 means the period July 1, 2012, through June 30, 2013. Sec. 2. APPROPRIATION LANGUAGE. There are hereby appropriated, for FY2009-10 and FY2010-11, the sums set forth in this act to each agency for each program from the respective funds for the general operations of state government, postsecondary education, and state aid, except as otherwise appropriated.

16 Sec. 3. REAPPROPRIATION OF BALANCE, FY2008-09 to 17 FY2009-10.

18 In addition to the appropriations set forth in this 19 act, there are hereby reappropriated all unexpended appropriation 20 balances existing on June 30, 2009, for FY2009-10 to the respective 21 agencies, programs, and funds listed in this act, unless otherwise 22 expressly provided.

23 Sec. 4. REAPPROPRIATION OF BALANCE, FY2009-10 to 24 FY2010-11.

25 In addition to the appropriations set forth in this

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1 act, there are hereby reappropriated all unexpended appropriation 2 balances existing on June 30, 2010, for FY2010-11 to the respective 3 agencies, programs, and funds listed in this act, except as 4 otherwise provided in this act. Sec. 5. CERTIFIED ENCUMBRANCES. 5 6 All certified encumbrance amounts on June 30, 2009, and 7 June 30, 2010, not otherwise reappropriated pursuant to sections 8 3 and 4 of this act, are hereby reappropriated for FY2009-10 and 9 FY2010-11, respectively, which amounts shall be in addition to the 10 amounts shown in this act. 11 Sec. 6. NEBRASKA ACCOUNTING SYSTEM MANUAL DEFINITIONS. 12 The definitions contained in the Nebraska Accounting 13 System Manual, and any amendments thereto, on file with the Clerk of the Legislature are hereby adopted by the Legislature as the 14 15 definitions for this act, except as provided in sections 143 and 16 284 of this act. 17 Sec. 7. ARRA DEFINITION. 18 As used in this act, ARRA means the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, Public Law 111-5. 19 Sec. 8. DRAWING AND PAYING WARRANTS. 20 21 The Director of Administrative Services shall draw 22 warrants upon the proper fund in the state treasury for an amount 23 not to exceed the appropriations set forth in this act upon presentation of proper documentation. The State Treasurer shall pay 24 25 the warrants out of the appropriate funds.

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Sec. 9. BUDGET STATUS REPORTS.

All state agencies, boards, and commissions shall 2 3 promptly establish their detailed Budget Status Reports at the budget subprogram level in the Nebraska Accounting System and 4 5 adjust them as necessary during each fiscal year to reflect the most current appropriations shown on the Allotment Status Report. 6 7 Sec. 10. There is included in the appropriation to this program for FY2009-10 \$80,000 General Funds and for FY2010-11 \$80,000 General Funds, which appropriations shall only be administratively

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transferred to program classification number 272, and such 1 2 appropriations shall only be expended from budget subprogram 6 as a 3 separate and distinct budget subprogram and shall not be commingled with any other expenses, and such appropriations shall only be used 4 5 to provide assistance for legal expenses incurred in prosecuting 6 crimes against children by state and local prosecutors, including, 7 but not limited to, expert witness costs, as determined by the 8 Attorney General.

9 There is included in the appropriation to this program 10 for FY2009-10 \$50,000 General Funds in program classification 11 number 272, subprogram 7, and for FY2010-11 \$50,000 General Funds, 12 which appropriations shall only be administratively transferred to 13 program classification number 272, and such appropriations shall only be expended from budget subprogram 7 as a separate and 14 15 distinct budget subprogram and shall not be commingled with any 16 other expenses, and such appropriations shall only be used to pay 17 for child autopsy expenses.

18 General Fund expenditures within program classification 19 number 273 shall only be coded against budget subprogram 1. 20 Revolving Fund expenditures within program classification number 21 273 shall only be coded against budget subprogram 4.

22 With the exception of water law division appropriations, 23 all other General Fund expenditures for the public protection 24 bureau within program classification number 274 shall only be coded 25 against budget subprogram 1. General Fund expenditures for the

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1 water law division within program classification number 274 shall 2 only be coded against budget subprogram 2. Cash Fund expenditures 3 for motor vehicle fraud enforcement within program classification 4 number 274 shall only be coded against budget subprogram 3.

5 There is included in the appropriation to this program 6 for FY2009-10 \$385,200 Cash Funds and for FY2010-11 \$395,807 7 Cash Funds, which appropriations shall only be administratively 8 transferred to program classification number 274, and such 9 appropriations shall only be expended directly from the Nebraska 10 Health Care Cash Fund from budget subprogram 4 for purposes of 11 enforcing the tobacco settlement agreement.

12 There is included in the appropriation to this program 13 for FY2009-10 \$10,000 Cash Funds and for FY2010-11 \$10,000 14 Cash Funds, which appropriations shall only be administratively 15 transferred to program classification number 274, and such 16 appropriations shall only be expended from budget subprogram 6 17 for purposes of administering the Department of Justice Natural 18 Resources Enforcement Fund.

19 It is the intent of the Legislature that any General 20 Fund appropriation authority to Agency 11, Program 575, shall 21 continue to be used for the purpose of meeting the state agency's 22 matching share of federal Byrne Grant funds awarded by the Nebraska 23 Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice.
