- 1 FOR AN ACT relating to public assistance; to amend section 68-1721,
- 2 Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2008; to provide
- 3 for vocational training as prescribed; and to repeal the
- 4 original section.
- 5 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 68-1721, Revised Statutes Cumulative

- 2 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:
- 3 68-1721 (1) Under the self-sufficiency contract developed
- 4 under section 68-1719, the principal wage earner and other
- 5 nonexempt members of the applicant family shall be required to
- 6 participate in one or more of the following approved activities,
- 7 including, but not limited to, education, job skills training, work
- 8 experience, job search, or employment.
- 9 (2) Education shall consist of the general education
- 10 development program, high school, Adult Basic Education, English
- 11 as a Second Language, postsecondary education, or other education
- 12 programs approved in the contract.
- 13 (3) Job skills training shall include vocational
- 14 training in technical job skills and equivalent knowledge.
- 15 Activities shall consist of formalized, technical job skills
- 16 training, apprenticeships, on-the-job training, or training in the
- 17 operation of a microbusiness enterprise. The types of training,
- 18 apprenticeships, or training positions may include, but need not be
- 19 limited to, the ability to provide services such as home repairs,
- 20 automobile repairs, respite care, foster care, personal care, and
- 21 child care. Job skills training shall be prioritized and approved
- 22 for occupations that facilitate economic self-sufficiency.
- 23 (4) The purpose of work experience shall be to improve
- 24 the employability of applicants by providing work experience and
- 25 training to assist them to move promptly into regular public or

1 private employment. Work experience shall mean unpaid work in a

- 2 public, private, for-profit, or nonprofit business or organization.
- 3 Work experience placements shall take into account the individual's
- 4 prior training, skills, and experience. A placement shall not
- 5 exceed six months.
- 6 (5) Job search shall assist adult members of recipient
- 7 families in finding their own jobs. The emphasis shall be placed on
- 8 teaching the individual to take responsibility for his or her own
- 9 job development and placement.
- 10 (6) Employment shall consist of work for pay. The
- 11 employment may be full-time or part-time but shall be adequate
- 12 to help the recipient family reach economic self-sufficiency.
- 13 (7) For purposes of creating the self-sufficiency
- 14 contract and meeting the applicant's work activity requirement, an
- 15 applicant shall be allowed to engage in vocational training that
- 16 <u>leads to an associate degree, a diploma, or a certificate for a</u>
- 17 minimum of twenty hours per week for up to thirty-six months. This
- 18 subsection terminates on September 30, 2012.
