1	FOR	AN	ACT relating to water resources; to amend sections
2			2-1599, 2-15,100, 2-15,101, 2-15,103, 2-15,105, 2-15,106,
3			and 61-206, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, and
4			sections 49-506 and 49-617, Revised Statutes Cumulative
5			Supplement, 2008; to adopt the Nebraska Statewide Water
6			Planning Commission Act; to harmonize provisions; and to
7			repeal the original sections.

8 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1	Section 1. <u>Sections 1 to 13 of this act shall be</u>
2	known and may be cited as the Nebraska Statewide Water Planning
3	Commission Act.
4	Sec. 2. <u>For purposes of the Nebraska Statewide Water</u>
5	Planning Commission Act:
6	(1) Commission means the Nebraska Statewide Water
7	Planning Commission; and
8	(2) Executive director means the executive director of
9	the Nebraska Statewide Water Planning Commission.
10	Sec. 3. <u>(1) The Nebraska Statewide Water Planning</u>
11	Commission is created. The commission shall consist of seven
12	members, appointed by the Governor and subject to confirmation by
13	a majority of the members elected to the Legislature. A member may
14	be removed by the Governor for cause. Of the members initially
15	appointed, three shall serve for terms of two years and four shall
16	serve for terms of four years. Thereafter, members shall serve for
17	terms of four years and until their successors are appointed and
18	qualified.
19	(2) The commission shall exercise the powers and perform
20	the duties carried out by the Division of Planning and Assistance
21	of the Department of Natural Resources before the effective date of
22	this act and the duties described in the Nebraska Statewide Water
23	Planning Commission Act.
24	Sec. 4. (1) The chief administrative officer of the
25	commission shall be the executive director. The executive director

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shall be appointed by the members of the commission. The executive 1 2 director shall employ such personnel, including legal and technical 3 personnel, as may be required to carry out the duties and responsibilities of the commission. 4 5 (2) The executive director shall adopt a seal. Copies of 6 all records or other instruments of the commission when certified 7 by the commission as true copies and bearing the seal thereof shall 8 be received in any court as prima facie evidence of the original 9 record or instruments. 10 Sec. 5. (1) The executive director may adopt and 11 promulgate rules and regulations for the commission. The executive 12 director shall administer rules and regulations adopted and 13 promulgated by the commission. 14 (2) The rules, regulations, and orders of the Department 15 of Natural Resources and the Nebraska Natural Resources Commission relating to duties transferred to the Nebraska Statewide Water 16 17 Planning Commission pursuant to the Nebraska Statewide Water 18 Planning Commission Act shall remain in effect unless changed 19 or eliminated by the executive director. 20 Sec. 6. The duties of the commission include, but are not 21 limited to: 22 (1) Developing a statewide plan for the future use of

23 water in the state;

24 <u>(2) Maintaining and maximizing the use of water in this</u>
25 <u>state;</u>

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1	(3) Creating a plan to manage the state's water resources
2	to encourage economic health and prosperity; and
3	(4) Make recommendations to the Governor and the
4	Legislature for achieving the goals set forth in the plan developed
5	pursuant to subdivision (1) of this section.
6	Sec. 7. <u>(1) The Nebraska Statewide Water Planning</u>
7	Commission Fund is created. The fund shall consist of funds
8	appropriated by the Legislature and transfers by the State
9	Treasurer pursuant to this section. Any money in the fund available
10	for investment shall be invested by the state investment officer
11	pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska
12	State Funds Investment Act.
13	(2) On the effective date of this act, or as soon
14	thereafter as administratively possible:
15	(a) The State Treasurer shall transfer any unexpended
16	and unobligated funds allocated to the Division of Planning and
17	Assistance of the Department of Natural Resources for the 2009-11
18	biennium to the Nebraska Statewide Water Planning Commission Fund;
19	and
20	(b) The State Treasurer shall transfer the unexpended and
21	unobligated balance of the Water Policy Task Force Cash Fund to the
22	Nebraska Statewide Water Planning Commission Fund.
23	Sec. 8. Section 2-1599, Reissue Revised Statutes of
24	Nebraska, is amended to read:
25	2-1599 In order to provide for the effective conservation

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and management of Nebraska's water resources, the Legislature 1 2 hereby endorses the concept of a state water planning and 3 review process. The purpose of this planning process shall be to coordinate and direct the planning efforts of the state agencies 4 5 and university divisions with responsibilities and interest in 6 the water resources field. This interagency planning process shall 7 be designed to: (1) Provide the Legislature and the citizens of 8 Nebraska with information and alternative methods of addressing 9 important water policy issues and areawide or statewide water 10 resources problems; (2) provide coordinated interagency reviews 11 of proposed local, state, and federal water resources programs 12 and projects; (3) develop and maintain the data, information, 13 and analysis capabilities necessary to provide state agencies and 14 other water interests with a support base for water planning and 15 management activities; (4) provide the state with the capacity to 16 plan and design water resources projects; and (5) conduct any other 17 planning activities necessary to protect and promote the interests 18 of the state and its citizens in the water resources of Nebraska.

Sec. 9. Section 2-15,100, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

21 2-15,100 The state water planning and review process 22 shall be conducted under the guidance and general supervision of 23 the <u>executive</u> director. The <u>executive</u> director shall be assisted in 24 the state water planning and review process by the <u>Department of</u> 25 Natural Resources, the Game and Parks Commission, the Department of

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Agriculture, the Governor's Policy Research Office, the Department of Health and Human Services, the Department of Environmental Quality, the Water Center of the University of Nebraska, and the Conservation and Survey Division of the University of Nebraska. In addition, the <u>executive</u> director may obtain assistance from any private individual, organization, political subdivision, or agency of the state or federal government.

8 Sec. 10. Section 2-15,101, Reissue Revised Statutes of
9 Nebraska, is amended to read:

10 2-15,101 Appropriations may be made to the department 11 commission for all or part of the costs incurred by agencies 12 other than the department commission in conducting the state water 13 planning and review process. The state budget administrator shall 14 create a separate budget program within each agency that is to 15 receive a portion of such appropriations. To properly account for 16 such funds, recipients shall submit to the department, commission, 17 in the form prescribed by the department, commission, documentation 18 of all costs incurred in rendering services determined by the 19 department commission to be eligible for reimbursement.

Sec. 11. Section 2-15,103, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

22 2-15,103 The commission shall provide the <u>executive</u> 23 director and the Legislature upon request with the opinion of 24 the general public and various water interests in the state. It 25 is the intent of the Legislature that the commission consider the

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different opinions of the individual members but, as a body, it 1 2 shall provide the executive director with input and comments on 3 state water planning and review process activities as they relate to the overall use of Nebraska's water resources. The functions 4 5 of the commission shall include providing upon request advice and assistance in the planning process by: (1) Identifying legislative 6 7 and administrative policy issues; (2) developing and reviewing 8 alternative solutions for legislative and administrative policy 9 problems, including impact assessment; (3) recommending the types 10 of problems needing analysis and where such problems are located or 11 likely to be located; (4) disseminating information and materials 12 generated by the planning process to the public; (5) determining 13 the conditions under which and the methods by which additional 14 public input is to be obtained; and (6) reviewing and commenting on 15 reports produced through the planning process.

Sec. 12. Section 2-15,105, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

18 2-15,105 It is the intent of the Legislature that the public have maximum input into the formulation of state water 19 20 policy. The executive director shall conduct one or more public 21 hearings prior to the completion of any recommendations to the Legislature on methods of addressing water policy issues. All 22 materials produced as part of the state water planning and review 23 24 process shall be available to interested persons and groups upon 25 request. The department commission or other agency providing such

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1 material may make a charge therefor which does not exceed the 2 actual cost of providing the same.

3 Sec. 13. Section 2-15,106, Reissue Revised Statutes of
4 Nebraska, is amended to read:

5 2-15,106 On or before September 15 for each odd-numbered year and on or before the date provided in section 81-132 for 6 7 each even-numbered year, the executive director shall submit an 8 annual report and plan of work for the state water planning and 9 review process to the Legislature and Governor. The report shall 10 include a listing of expenditures for the past fiscal year, a 11 summary and analysis of work completed in the past fiscal year, 12 funding requirements for the next fiscal year, and a projection and 13 analysis of work to be completed and estimated funding requirements 14 for such work for the next succeeding four years. The explanation 15 of future funding requirements shall include an explanation of 16 the proposed use of such funds and the anticipated results of the expenditure of such funds. The report shall, to the extent 17 18 possible, identify such information as it affects each agency 19 or other recipient of program funds. The explanation of future 20 funding requirements shall be in a form suitable for providing an 21 explanation of that portion of the budget request pertaining to the 22 state water planning and review process.

23 Sec. 14. Section 49-506, Revised Statutes Cumulative
24 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:

25 49-506 After the Secretary of State has made the

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distribution provided by section 49-503, he or she shall deliver additional copies of the session laws and the journal of the Legislature pursuant to this section in print or electronic format as he or she determines, upon recommendation by the Clerk of the Legislature and approval of the Executive Board of the Legislative Council.

7 One copy of the session laws shall be delivered to 8 the Lieutenant Governor, the State Treasurer, the Auditor of 9 Public Accounts, the Reporter of the Supreme Court and Court of 10 Appeals, the State Court Administrator, the State Fire Marshal, 11 the Department of Administrative Services, the Department of 12 Aeronautics, the Department of Agriculture, the Department of 13 Banking and Finance, the State Department of Education, the 14 Department of Environmental Quality, the Department of Insurance, 15 the Department of Labor, the Department of Motor Vehicles, the 16 Department of Revenue, the Department of Roads, the Department of Veterans' Affairs, the Department of Natural Resources, the 17 18 Military Department, the Nebraska State Patrol, the Nebraska 19 Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice, each of 20 the Nebraska state colleges, the Game and Parks Commission, 21 the Nebraska Library Commission, the Nebraska Liquor Control 22 Commission, the Nebraska Accountability and Disclosure Commission, 23 the Nebraska Statewide Water Planning Commission, the Public 24 Service Commission, the State Real Estate Commission, the Nebraska 25 State Historical Society, the Public Employees Retirement Board,

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the Risk Manager, the Legislative Fiscal Analyst, the Public 1 2 Counsel, the materiel division of the Department of Administrative 3 Services, the State Records Administrator, the budget division of the Department of Administrative Services, the Tax Equalization 4 and Review Commission, the inmate library at all state penal 5 and correctional institutions, the Commission on Public Advocacy, 6 7 and the Library of Congress; two copies to the Governor, the 8 Secretary of State, the Nebraska Workers' Compensation Court, the 9 Commission of Industrial Relations, and the Coordinating Commission 10 for Postsecondary Education, one of which shall be for use by 11 the community colleges; three copies to the Department of Health 12 and Human Services; four copies to the Nebraska Publications 13 Clearinghouse; five copies to the Attorney General; nine copies to 14 the Revisor of Statutes; sixteen copies to the Supreme Court and 15 the Legislative Council; and thirty-five copies to the University 16 of Nebraska College of Law.

One copy of the journal of the Legislature shall be 17 18 delivered to the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the State Treasurer, the Auditor of Public Accounts, the Reporter of the 19 20 Supreme Court and Court of Appeals, the State Court Administrator, 21 the Nebraska State Historical Society, the Legislative Fiscal 22 Analyst, the Tax Equalization and Review Commission, the Commission on Public Advocacy, and the Library of Congress; two copies to 23 the Secretary of State, the Commission of Industrial Relations, 24 25 and the Nebraska Workers' Compensation Court; four copies to the

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Nebraska Publications Clearinghouse; five copies to the Attorney 1 2 General and the Revisor of Statutes; eight copies to the Clerk 3 of the Legislature; thirteen copies to the Supreme Court and the Legislative Council; and thirty-five copies to the University of 4 5 Nebraska College of Law. The remaining copies shall be delivered 6 to the State Librarian who shall use the same, so far as required 7 for exchange purposes, in building up the State Library and in the 8 manner specified in sections 49-507 to 49-509.

9 Sec. 15. Section 49-617, Revised Statutes Cumulative
10 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:

11 49-617 The Revisor of Statutes shall cause the statutes 12 to be printed. The printer shall deliver all completed copies to 13 the Supreme Court. These copies shall be held and disposed of by the court as follows: Sixty copies to the State Library to 14 15 exchange for statutes of other states; five copies to the State 16 Library to keep for daily use; not to exceed twenty-five copies to the Legislative Council for bill drafting and related services 17 18 to the Legislature and executive state officers; as many copies 19 to the Attorney General as he or she has attorneys on his or her 20 staff; as many copies to the Commission on Public Advocacy as it 21 has attorneys on its staff; up to sixteen copies to the State 22 Court Administrator; thirteen copies to the Tax Commissioner; eight 23 copies to the Nebraska Publications Clearinghouse; six copies to the Public Service Commission; four copies to the Secretary of 24 25 State; four copies to the Tax Equalization and Review Commission;

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four copies to the Clerk of the Legislature for use in his or 1 2 her office and three copies to be maintained in the legislative 3 chamber, one copy on each side of the chamber and one copy at the desk of the Clerk of the Legislature, under control of the sergeant 4 5 at arms; three copies to the Auditor of Public Accounts; three copies to the Department of Health and Human Services; two copies 6 7 each to the Governor of the state, the Chief Justice and each 8 judge of the Supreme Court, each judge of the Court of Appeals, 9 the Clerk of the Supreme Court, the Reporter of the Supreme Court 10 and Court of Appeals, the Commissioner of Labor, and the Revisor 11 of Statutes; one copy each to the Secretary of State of the 12 United States, each Indian tribal court located in the State of 13 Nebraska, the library of the Supreme Court of the United States, 14 the Adjutant General, the Air National Guard, the Commissioner 15 of Education, the State Treasurer, the Board of Educational 16 Lands and Funds, the Director of Agriculture, the Director of 17 Administrative Services, the Director of Aeronautics, the Director 18 of Economic Development, the director of the Public Employees Retirement Board, the Director-State Engineer, the Director of 19 20 Banking and Finance, the Director of Insurance, the Director of 21 Motor Vehicles, the Director of Veterans' Affairs, the Director 22 of Natural Resources, the Director of Correctional Services, the executive director of the Nebraska Statewide Water Planning 23 24 Commission, the Nebraska Emergency Operating Center, each judge of 25 the Nebraska Workers' Compensation Court, each commissioner of the

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Commission of Industrial Relations, the Nebraska Liquor Control 1 2 Commission, the State Real Estate Commission, the secretary of 3 the Game and Parks Commission, the Board of Pardons, each state institution under the Department of Health and Human Services, 4 5 each state institution under the State Department of Education, the State Surveyor, the Nebraska State Patrol, the materiel division of 6 7 the Department of Administrative Services, the personnel division 8 of the Department of Administrative Services, the Nebraska Motor 9 Vehicle Industry Licensing Board, the Board of Trustees of the 10 Nebraska State Colleges, each of the Nebraska state colleges, each 11 district judge of the State of Nebraska, each judge of the county 12 court, each judge of a separate juvenile court, the Lieutenant 13 Governor, each United States Senator from Nebraska, each United 14 States Representative from Nebraska, each clerk of the district 15 court for the use of the district court, the clerk of the Nebraska 16 Workers' Compensation Court, each clerk of the county court, each 17 county attorney, each county public defender, each county law 18 library, and the inmate library at all state penal and correctional institutions, and each member of the Legislature shall be entitled 19 20 to two complete sets, and two complete sets of such volumes as are 21 necessary to update previously issued volumes, but each member of 22 the Legislature and each judge of any court referred to in this 23 section shall be entitled, on request, to an additional complete 24 set. Copies of the statutes distributed without charge, as listed 25 in this section, shall be the property of the state or governmental

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subdivision of the state and not the personal property of the

particular person receiving a copy. Distribution of statutes to the 3 library of the College of Law of the University of Nebraska shall be as provided in sections 85-176 and 85-177. 4

Sec. 16. Section 61-206, Reissue Revised Statutes of 5 Nebraska, is amended to read: 6

7 61-206 (1) The Department of Natural Resources is given 8 jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to water rights for 9 irrigation, power, or other useful purposes except as such 10 jurisdiction is specifically limited by statute. Such department 11 shall adopt and promulgate rules and regulations governing matters 12 coming before it. It may refuse to allow any water to be used 13 by claimants until their rights have been determined and made 14 of record. It may request information relative to irrigation and 15 water power works from any county, irrigation, or power officers 16 and from any other persons. It may have hearings on complaints, 17 petitions, or applications in connection with any of such matters. 18 Such hearings shall be had at the time and place designated by 19 the department. The department shall have power to certify official 20 acts, compel attendance of witnesses, take testimony by deposition 21 as in suits at law, and examine books, papers, documents, and 22 records of any county, party, or parties interested in any of the 23 matters mentioned in this section or have such examinations made 24 by its qualified representative and shall make and preserve a true 25 and complete transcript of its proceedings and hearings. If a final

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decision is made without a hearing, a hearing shall be held at 1 2 the request of any party to the proceeding if the request is made 3 within thirty days after the decision is rendered. If a hearing is held at the request of one or more parties, the department may 4 5 require each such requesting party and each person who requests to 6 be made a party to such hearing to pay the proportional share of 7 the cost of such transcript. Upon any hearing, the department shall 8 receive any evidence relevant to the matter under investigation and 9 the burden of proof shall be upon the person making the complaint, 10 petition, and application. After such hearing and investigation, 11 the department shall render a decision in the premises in writing 12 and shall issue such order or orders duly certified as it may deem 13 necessary.

(2) The Except as provided in the Nebraska Statewide
Water Planning Commission Act, the department shall serve as the
official agency of the state in connection with water resources
development, soil and water conservation, flood prevention,
watershed protection, and flood control.

19 (3) The department shall:

(a) Offer assistance as appropriate to the supervisors or
directors of any subdivision of government with responsibilities in
the area of natural resources conservation, development, and use in
the carrying out of any of their powers and programs;

(b) Keep the supervisors or directors of each such
subdivision informed of the activities and experience of all other

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such subdivisions and facilitate cooperation and an interchange of
 advice and experience between such subdivisions;

3 (c) Coordinate the programs of such subdivisions so far
4 as this may be done by advice and consultation;

5 (d) Secure the cooperation and assistance of the United 6 States, any of its agencies, and agencies of this state in the work 7 of such subdivisions;

8 (e) Disseminate information throughout the state
9 concerning the activities and programs of such subdivisions;

10 (f) Plan, develop, and promote the implementation of a 11 comprehensive program of resource development, conservation, and 12 utilization for the soil and water resources of this state in 13 cooperation with other local, state, and federal agencies and 14 organizations;

15 (g) When necessary for the proper administration of the 16 functions of the department, rent or lease space outside the State 17 Capitol; and

(h) Assist such local governmental organizations as
villages, cities, counties, and natural resources districts in
securing, planning, and developing information on flood plains to
be used in developing regulations and ordinances on proper use of
these flood plains.
