#### A BILL

- FOR AN ACT relating to revenue and taxation; to amend section

  9-812, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska; to change

  provisions relating to lottery funds; to repeal the

  original section; to provide an operative date; and to

  declare an emergency.
- 6 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1 Section 1. Section 9-812, Reissue Revised Statutes of

- 2 Nebraska, is amended to read:
- 3 9-812 (1) All money received from the operation of
- 4 lottery games conducted pursuant to the State Lottery Act in
- 5 Nebraska shall be credited to the State Lottery Operation Trust
- 6 Fund, which fund is hereby created. All payments of the costs
- 7 of establishing and maintaining the lottery games shall be made
- 8 from the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund. In accordance with
- 9 legislative appropriations, money for payments for expenses of the
- 10 division shall be transferred from the State Lottery Operation
- 11 Trust Fund to the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund, which fund
- 12 is hereby created. All money necessary for the payment of lottery
- 13 prizes shall be transferred from the State Lottery Operation Trust
- 14 Fund to the State Lottery Prize Trust Fund, which fund is hereby
- 15 created. The amount used for the payment of lottery prizes shall
- 16 not be less than forty percent of the dollar amount of the lottery
- 17 tickets which have been sold.
- 18 (2)(a) (2) Beginning October 1, 2003, and until July 1,
- 19 2009, a portion of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which
- 20 have been sold on an annualized basis shall be transferred from
- 21 the State Lottery Operation Trust Fund to the Education Innovation
- 22 Fund, the Nebraska Scholarship Fund, the Nebraska Environmental
- 23 Trust Fund, the Nebraska State Fair Board, and the Compulsive
- 24 Gamblers Assistance Fund. The dollar amount transferred pursuant
- 25 to this subsection shall equal the greater of (a) the dollar

1 amount transferred to the funds in fiscal year 2002-03 or (b)

- 2 any amount which constitutes at least twenty-two percent and no
- 3 more than twenty-five percent of the dollar amount of the lottery
- 4 tickets which have been sold on an annualized basis. To the extent
- 5 that funds are available, the Tax Commissioner and director may
- 6 authorize a transfer exceeding twenty-five percent of the dollar
- 7 amount of the lottery tickets sold on an annualized basis. 7 except
- 8 that the dollar amount transferred shall not be less than the
- 9 dollar amount transferred to the funds in fiscal year 2002-03.
- 10 (b) On and after July 1, 2009, at least twenty-five
- 11 percent of the dollar amount of the lottery tickets which have been
- 12 sold on an annualized basis shall be transferred from the State
- 13 Lottery Operation Trust Fund to the Education Innovation Fund,
- 14 the Nebraska Scholarship Fund, the Nebraska Environmental Trust
- 15 Fund, the Nebraska State Fair Board, and the Compulsive Gamblers
- 16 Assistance Fund.
- 17 (3) Of the money available to be transferred to the
- 18 Education Innovation Fund, the Nebraska Scholarship Fund, the
- 19 Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund, the Nebraska State Fair Board,
- 20 and the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund:
- 21 (a) The first five hundred thousand dollars shall be
- 22 transferred to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used
- 23 as provided in section 71-817;
- 24 (b) Nineteen and three-fourths percent of the money
- 25 remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and

1 the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund

- 2 shall be transferred to the Education Innovation Fund;
- 3 (c) Twenty-four and three-fourths percent of the money
- 4 remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and
- 5 the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund
- 6 shall be transferred to the Nebraska Scholarship Fund;
- 7 (d) Forty-four and one-half percent of the money
- 8 remaining after the payment of prizes and operating expenses and
- 9 the initial transfer to the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund
- 10 shall be transferred to the Nebraska Environmental Trust Fund to be
- 11 used as provided in the Nebraska Environmental Trust Act;
- 12 (e) Ten percent of the money remaining after the payment
- 13 of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to
- 14 the Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to
- 15 the Nebraska State Fair Board if the most populous city within
- 16 the county in which the fair is located provides matching funds
- 17 equivalent to ten percent of the funds available for transfer. Such
- 18 matching funds may be obtained from the city and any other private
- 19 or public entity, except that no portion of such matching funds
- 20 shall be provided by the state. If the Nebraska State Fair ceases
- 21 operations, ten percent of the money remaining after the payment
- 22 of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the
- 23 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the
- 24 General Fund; and
- 25 (f) One percent of the money remaining after the payment

1 of prizes and operating expenses and the initial transfer to the

- 2 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund shall be transferred to the
- 3 Compulsive Gamblers Assistance Fund to be used as provided in
- 4 section 71-817.
- 5 (4)(a) The Education Innovation Fund is created. At least
- 6 seventy-five percent of the lottery proceeds allocated to the
- 7 Education Innovation Fund shall be available for disbursement.
- 8 (b) For fiscal year 2005-06, the Education Innovation
- 9 Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first one million dollars
- 10 shall be transferred to the School District Reorganization Fund,
- 11 and the remaining amount shall be allocated to the General Fund
- 12 after operating expenses for the Excellence in Education Council
- 13 are deducted.
- 14 (c) For fiscal year 2006-07, the Education Innovation
- 15 Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first two hundred fifty
- 16 thousand dollars shall be transferred to the Attracting Excellence
- 17 to Teaching Program Cash Fund to fund the Attracting Excellence
- 18 to Teaching Program Act, the next one million dollars shall
- 19 be transferred to the School District Reorganization Fund, and
- 20 the amount remaining in the Education Innovation Fund shall be
- 21 allocated, after administrative expenses, for distance education
- 22 equipment and incentives pursuant to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337.
- 23 (d) For fiscal year 2007-08, the Education Innovation
- 24 Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first five hundred thousand
- 25 dollars shall be transferred to the Attracting Excellence to

1 Teaching Program Cash Fund to fund the Attracting Excellence to

- 2 Teaching Program Act, and the amount remaining in the Education
- 3 Innovation Fund shall be allocated, after administrative expenses,
- 4 for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant to
- 5 sections 79-1336 and 79-1337.
- 6 (e) For fiscal year 2008-09, the Education Innovation
- 7 Fund shall be allocated as follows: The first seven hundred
- 8 fifty thousand dollars shall be transferred to the Attracting
- 9 Excellence to Teaching Program Cash Fund to fund the Attracting
- 10 Excellence to Teaching Program Act, and the amount remaining in the
- 11 Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated, after administrative
- 12 expenses, for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant
- 13 to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337.
- 14 (f) For fiscal years 2009-10 through 2015-16, the
- 15 Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated as follows: The
- 16 first one million dollars shall be transferred to the Attracting
- 17 Excellence to Teaching Program Cash Fund to fund the Attracting
- 18 Excellence to Teaching Program Act, and the amount remaining in the
- 19 Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated, after administrative
- 20 expenses, for distance education equipment and incentives pursuant
- 21 to sections 79-1336 and 79-1337.
- 22 (g) For fiscal year 2016-17 and each fiscal year
- 23 thereafter, the Education Innovation Fund shall be allocated,
- 24 after administrative expenses, for education purposes as provided
- 25 by the Legislature.

1 (5) Any money in the State Lottery Operation Trust

- 2 Fund, the State Lottery Operation Cash Fund, the State Lottery
- 3 Prize Trust Fund, or the Education Innovation Fund available
- 4 for investment shall be invested by the state investment officer
- 5 pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act and the Nebraska
- 6 State Funds Investment Act.
- 7 (6) Unclaimed prize money on a winning lottery ticket
- 8 shall be retained for a period of time prescribed by rules and
- 9 regulations. If no claim is made within such period, the prize
- 10 money shall be used at the discretion of the Tax Commissioner for
- 11 any of the purposes prescribed in this section.
- 12 Sec. 2. This act becomes operative on June 30, 2009.
- Sec. 3. Original section 9-812, Reissue Revised Statutes
- 14 of Nebraska, is repealed.
- 15 Sec. 4. Since an emergency exists, this act takes effect
- 16 when passed and approved according to law.
