- 1 FOR AN ACT relating to health care; to adopt the Area Health
- 2 Education Centers Act.
- 3 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

1	Section 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as
2	the Area Health Education Centers Act.
3	Sec. 2. For purposes of the Area Health Education Centers
4	Act, area health education center means a private, nonprofit
5	organization that has a cooperative agreement in effect with the
6	University of Nebraska Medical Center for the purpose of planning,
7	developing, and operating an area health education center program
8	and that has as one of its principal functions identifying and
9	implementing strategies and activities that address health care
10	workforce needs in underserved urban communities and federally
11	designated rural or nonmetropolitan communities.
12	Sec. 3. Area health education centers shall:
13	(1) Develop and implement strategies to recruit into
14	careers in health care professions individuals (a) from underserved
15	urban communities, (b) who grew up in, resided a substantial
16	portion of their life in, or attended high school in a federally
17	designated rural or nonmetropolitan community, and (c) from
18	underrepresented or rural populations into health careers;
19	(2) Develop and implement strategies to foster and
20	provide community-based training and education to individuals
21	seeking careers in health professions within underserved areas
22	and populations for the purpose of developing and maintaining
23	a diverse health care workforce that is prepared to deliver
24	high-quality health care in underserved urban communities and
25	federally designated rural or nonmetropolitan communities;

Before entering into a cooperative agreement with 3 an area health education center, the University of Nebraska Medical Center shall ensure that an area health education center: 4 5 (1) Is a private, nonprofit organization whose structure, 6 governance, and operation are independent from the University of 7 Nebraska Medical Center; 8 (2) Designates a geographic area or medically underserved 9 urban community or federally designated rural or nonmetropolitan 10 community to be served by the area health education center and does 11 not duplicate, in whole or in part, the community or population 12 served by any other area health education center; 13 (3) Fosters networking and collaboration among 14 communities and community-based health care providers; 15 (4) Serves urban communities and federally designated rural or nonmetropolitan communities with a demonstrated need for 16 17 health care professionals; 18 (5) Addresses the health care workforce needs of the 19 communities served; and 20 (6) Evaluates the performance of the area health 21 education center based on the criteria set out in section 3 of this 22 act and reports the findings on an annual basis. 23 Sec. 5. To assist area health education centers in 24 carrying out the Area Health Education Centers Act, the University

1	(1) Serve as a resource to area health education centers;
2	(2) Encourage collaboration between pertinent programs
3	administered by the University of Nebraska Medical Center and the
4	area health education centers;
5	(3) Take into consideration the capabilities of the
6	existing area health education centers prior to establishing
7	separate or parallel programs; and
8	(4) Evaluate the performance of the centers based on the
9	criteria set out in section 3 of this act and report the findings
10	to the Governor and Legislature annually.
