A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT relating to crime victims; to amend sections 81-1801,
2	81-1802, 81-1803, 81-1805, 81-1813, 81-1818, 81-1820,
3	81-1822, 81-1823, 81-1825, 81-1833, 81-1834, 81-1835,
4	81-1840, and 81-1841, Reissue Revised Statutes of
5	Nebraska; to authorize a Community Trust; to redefine
6	terms; to change provisions relating to the Nebraska
7	Crime Victim's Reparations Act; and to repeal the
8	original sections.

9 Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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1	Section 1. (1) A nonprofit organization, to be known
2	as the Community Trust, may be created. After a tragedy, the
3	Community Trust shall accept contributions from the public, manage
4	such funds, and make distributions to help individuals, families,
5	and communities in Nebraska who have suffered from a tragedy of
6	violence or natural disaster. The committee shall oversee the
7	Community Trust. The committee shall require at least annual
8	reports from the Community Trust.
9	(2) The Community Trust shall be a qualified organization
10	under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code thereby
11	enabling contributions to the Community Trust to be tax deductible
12	for the donor if the donor itemizes deductions for income
13	tax purposes and distributions to be tax-free under section
14	104(a)(2) or 139 of the Internal Revenue Code. The Community
15	Trust shall create a separate fund for each tragedy and shall
16	begin accepting contributions immediately after a tragedy. A
17	report of distributions shall be made within two weeks of the
18	distribution, and contributions shall be acknowledged within two
19	weeks of receipt.
20	(3) The procedures for applications, hearings, and
21	compensation orders for victims shall follow the procedures in the
22	Nebraska Crime Victim's Reparations Act, as applicable, unless the
23	board of directors of the Community Trust creates an alternative
24	procedure. In any alternative procedure, the Community Trust shall
25	establish a distribution committee for the tragedy within one

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week after the tragedy, establish eligible recipient criteria 1 2 and eligible uses of the fund, begin initial distribution of 3 the fund within three weeks after the tragedy, make subsequent distributions within three months after the tragedy, and complete 4 all distributions within six months after the tragedy. 5 Sec. 2. Section 81-1801, Reissue Revised Statutes of 6 7 Nebraska, is amended to read: 8 81-1801 For purposes of the Nebraska Crime Victim's 9 Reparations Act, unless the context otherwise requires: 10 (1) Commission shall mean the Nebraska Commission on Law 11 Enforcement and Criminal Justice; 12 (2) Committee shall mean the Crime Victim's Reparations 13 Committee; 14 (3) Dependent shall mean a relative of a deceased victim 15 who was dependent upon the victim's income at the time of death, 16 including a child of a victim born after a victim's death; 17 (4) Executive director shall mean the executive director 18 of the commission; 19 (5) Personal injury shall mean actual bodily harm; (6) Relative shall mean spouse, parent, grandparent, 20 21 stepparent, natural born child, stepchild, adopted child, grandchild, brother, sister, half brother, half sister, or spouse's 22 23 parent; and 24 (7) Victim shall mean a person who is injured or killed

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as a result of conduct specified in section 81-1818 or as a result

1 of a natural disaster.

Sec. 3. Section 81-1802, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

4 81-1802 A Crime Victim's Reparations Committee is hereby 5 created. The committee shall consist of five members of the 6 commission and two public members to be appointed by the Governor 7 subject to approval by the Legislature. <u>One public member shall</u> 8 represent charitable organizations, and one public member shall 9 represent businesses. The members of the committee shall select a 10 chairperson who is a member of the committee. commission.

Sec. 4. Section 81-1803, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

13 81-1803 Members of the committee shall serve for terms of 14 four years, except that of the <u>public</u> members first appointed two 15 <u>one</u> shall be appointed for terms <u>a term</u> of two years and three <u>one</u> 16 for terms a term of four years.

Sec. 5. Section 81-1805, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

19 81-1805 Members of the committee shall receive no
20 reimbursement for the performance of their duties as members of the
21 committee, except that such members shall receive reimbursement for
22 actual and necessary expenses as provided in sections 81-1174 to
23 81-1177. for state employees.

Sec. 6. Section 81-1813, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

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81-1813 The committee may, subject to the approval of the commission, adopt and promulgate rules and regulations prescribing the procedures to be followed in the filing of applications and proceedings under the Nebraska Crime Victim's Reparations Act and any other matters the committee considers appropriate, including special circumstances, such as when expenses of job retraining or similar employment-related rehabilitative services are involved, under which an award under the act from the Victim's Compensation Fund may exceed ten thousand dollars. The committee shall make available all forms and educational materials necessary to promote the existence of the programs to persons throughout the state. Sec. 7. Section 81-1818, Reissue Revised Statutes of Nebraska, is amended to read:

14 81-1818 The committee or hearing officer may order:

15 (1) The the payment of compensation from the Victim's
16 Compensation Fund or a distribution from the Community Trust for
17 personal injury or death which resulted from:

18 (1) (a) An attempt on the part of the applicant to
19 prevent the commission of crime, to apprehend a suspected criminal,
20 to aid or attempt to aid a police officer in the performance of his
21 or her duties, or to aid a victim of a crime; or

22 (2) (b) The commission or attempt on the part of one
23 other than the applicant of an unlawful criminal act committed or
24 attempted in the State of Nebraska; or -.

25 (2) A distribution from the Community Trust for loss

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1 <u>resulting from a natural disaster.</u>

Sec. 8. Section 81-1820, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

81-1820 (1) Prior to the hearing officer taking action 4 on an application for compensation from the Victim's Compensation 5 6 Fund, the applicant may request that a hearing officer make an 7 emergency award of compensation to the applicant. If it appears to 8 the hearing officer that the claim is one for which compensation 9 is probable and undue hardship will result to the applicant if 10 immediate payment is not made, the hearing officer may make an 11 emergency award of compensation to the applicant pending a final 12 decision in the case, except that:

13 (a) The amount of the emergency compensation shall not
14 exceed five hundred dollars;

15 (b) The amount of the emergency compensation shall be 16 deducted from the final compensation made to the applicant; and 17 (c) The excess amount of the emergency compensation over 18 the final amount shall be repaid by the applicant to the committee. 19 (2) If the hearing officer refuses to make an emergency 20 award of compensation to the applicant, the applicant may request 21 an emergency hearing before the committee which may be conducted 22 by means of teleconference. The committee shall forthwith specify 23 a time and place for an emergency hearing and shall give written notice to the applicant. If it appears to the committee that 24 25 the claim is one for which compensation is probable and undue

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(5) If the victim incurs an economic loss which does

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1 not exceed ten percent of his or her net financial resources. For 2 purposes of this subdivision, a victim's net financial resources 3 shall not include the present value of future earnings and shall be determined by the committee by deducting from the victim's total 4 5 financial resources: 6 (a) One year's earnings; 7 (b) The victim's equity in his or her home, not exceeding 8 thirty thousand dollars; 9 (c) One motor vehicle; and 10 (d) Any other property which would be exempt from 11 execution under section 25-1552 or 40-101. 12 Nothing in this section shall limit payments to a victim 13 by an offender which are made as full or partial restitution of 14 the victim's actual pecuniary loss. Subsection (5) of this section 15 shall not apply to distributions from the Community Trust. 16 Sec. 10. Section 81-1823, Reissue Revised Statutes of 17 Nebraska, is amended to read: 18 81-1823 Except as provided in section 81-1813, no 19 compensation shall be awarded under the Nebraska Crime Victim's 20 Reparations Act from the Victim's Compensation Fund in an amount 21 in excess of ten thousand dollars for each applicant per incident 22 unless expenses for job retraining or similar employment-related 23 rehabilitative services for the victim are deemed necessary. In such case, amounts in excess of ten thousand dollars shall be used 24 25 only for such purposes. Each award shall be paid in installments

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1 unless the hearing officer or committee decides otherwise.

Sec. 11. Section 81-1825, Reissue Revised Statutes of
Nebraska, is amended to read:

81-1825 When an order for the payment of compensation for 4 5 personal injury or death is made from the Victim's Compensation Fund, the committee shall be subrogated to the cause of action 6 7 of the applicant against the person responsible for the injury or 8 death and shall be entitled to bring an action against such person 9 for the amount of the damages sustained by the applicant. If an 10 amount greater than that paid under the order is recovered and collected in the action, the committee shall pay the balance to the 11 12 applicant.

Nebraska, is amended to read:

15 81-1833 (1) The committee shall prepare and submit to the commission a biennial report of its activities under the 16 17 Nebraska Crime Victim's Reparations Act, including the name of each 18 applicant, a brief description of the facts in each case, and the amount of compensation awarded, except that if the applicant was 19 20 the victim of a sexual assault the victim's name shall not be 21 included in the report, but shall be available to the Governor 22 or a member of the Legislature upon request to the committee. Such report shall be submitted to the Governor and Clerk of the 23 24 Legislature as part of the commission's report submitted pursuant 25 to section 81-1423.

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1 (2) The committee shall act as the oversight committee 2 for the Community Trust and shall annually report its activities 3 and findings as the oversight committee to the commission, the Governor, and the Clerk of the Legislature. If any questionable or 4 improper actions or inactions on the part of the Community Trust 5 are observed, the committee shall immediately notify the Attorney 6 7 General who shall investigate the matter. 8 Sec. 13. Section 81-1834, Reissue Revised Statutes of 9 Nebraska, is amended to read: 10 81-1834 Any award to a claimant and any judgment in 11 favor of a claimant under the Nebraska Crime Victim's Reparations 12 Act from the Victim's Compensation Fund shall be certified by the 13 committee to the Director of Administrative Services who shall 14 promptly issue a warrant for payment of such award of judgment 15 out of the Victim's Compensation Fund fund if sufficient money is 16 available in such fund. Sec. 14. Section 81-1835, Reissue Revised Statutes of 17 18 Nebraska, is amended to read: 19 81-1835 There is hereby established in the state treasury 20 a The Victim's Compensation Fund is created. The fund shall be 21 used to pay from which all awards or judgments under the Nebraska 22 Crime Victim's Reparations Act other than distributions from the 23 Community Trust. The shall be paid. This fund shall include deposits pursuant to sections 29-2286, 81-1836, and 83-183.01 and 24 25 shall be in such amount as the Legislature shall determine to be

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reasonably sufficient to meet anticipated claims. When the amount 1 2 of money in the fund is not sufficient to pay any awards or 3 judgments under the act, the Director of Administrative Services 4 shall immediately advise the Legislature and request an emergency 5 appropriation to satisfy such awards and judgments. Any money in 6 the fund available for investment shall be invested by the state 7 investment officer pursuant to the Nebraska Capital Expansion Act 8 and the Nebraska State Funds Investment Act.
