Section 1. Section 38-1708, Reissue Revised Statutes of
 Nebraska, is amended to read:

3 38-1708 The Massage Therapy Practice Act shall not be
4 construed to include the following classes of persons:

5 (1) Licensed physicians and surgeons, osteopathic physicians, chiropractors, registered nurses, practical nurses, 6 7 cosmetologists, estheticians, nail technicians, physical 8 therapists, barbers, and other persons credentialed under 9 the Uniform Credentialing Act who are exclusively engaged in the 10 practice of their respective professions;

(2) Physicians who serve in the armed forces of the United States or the United States Public Health Service or who are employed by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs or other federal agencies, if their practice is limited to that service or employment;

16 (3) Students performing massage therapy services when 17 they render such services within the scope of an approved 18 massage therapy school under the supervision of a licensed massage 19 therapist; and

(4) Individuals who hold a current license as a massage
therapist in another state and who travel with and provide massage
therapy services to theatrical groups, entertainers, or athletic
organizations; and.
