A BILL

1	FOR AN ACT relating to the Boiler Inspection Act; to amend section
2	48-722, Revised Statutes Cumulative Supplement, 2008;
3	to authorize inspections of domestic potable hot water
4	heaters; and to repeal the original section.
5	Be it enacted by the people of the State of Nebraska,

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Section 1. Section 48-722, Revised Statutes Cumulative
 Supplement, 2008, is amended to read:

48-722 (1) Except as provided in subsection (3) 3 subsections (3) and (4) of this section, the state boiler inspector 4 5 shall inspect or cause to be inspected at least once every 6 twelve months all boilers required to be inspected by the Boiler 7 Inspection Act to determine whether the boilers are in a safe and 8 satisfactory condition and properly constructed and maintained for 9 the purpose for which the boiler is used, except that (a) hobby 10 boilers, steam farm traction engines, portable and stationary show 11 engines, and portable and stationary show boilers, which are not 12 otherwise exempted from the act pursuant to section 48-726, shall 13 be subject to inspection at least once every twenty-four months and (b) the commissioner may, by rule and regulation, establish 14 15 inspection periods for pressure vessels of more than twelve months, 16 but not to exceed the inspection period recommended in the National 17 Board Inspection Code or the American Petroleum Institute Pressure 18 Vessel Inspection Code API-510 for pressure vessels being used for 19 similar purposes. In order to ensure that inspections are performed 20 in a timely manner, the department may contract with an authorized 21 inspection agency to perform any inspection authorized under 22 the Boiler Inspection Act. If the department contracts with an 23 authorized inspection agency to perform inspections, such contract 24 shall be in writing and shall contain an indemnification clause 25 wherein the authorized inspection agency agrees to indemnify and

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1 defend the department for loss occasioned by negligent or tortious 2 acts committed by special inspectors employed by such authorized 3 inspection agency when performing inspections on behalf of the 4 department.

5 (2) No boilers required to be inspected by the act shall be operated without valid and current certification pursuant to 6 7 rules and regulations adopted and promulgated by the commissioner 8 in accordance with the requirements of the Administrative Procedure 9 Act. The owner of any boiler installed after September 2, 1973, 10 shall file a manufacturer's data report covering the construction 11 of such boiler with the state boiler inspector. Such reports shall 12 be used to assist the state boiler inspector in the certification 13 of boilers. No boiler required to be inspected by the Boiler 14 Inspection Act shall be operated at any type of public gathering or 15 show without first being inspected and certified as to its safety 16 by the state boiler inspector or a special inspector commissioned pursuant to section 48-731. Antique engines with boilers may be 17 18 brought into the state from other states without inspection, but 19 inspection as provided in this section shall be made and the boiler 20 certified as safe before being operated.

(3) The commissioner may, by rule and regulation, waive the inspection of unfired pressure vessels registered with the State of Nebraska if the commissioner finds that the owner or user of the unfired pressure vessel follows a safety inspection and repair program that is based upon nationally recognized standards.

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1 <u>(4) The commissioner may, by rule and regulation,</u> 2 establish an inspection schedule for domestic potable hot water 3 heaters of external inspections once every two years and internal 4 inspections once every six years.
